

Arts in the Ville 2018

The great turnout for Labour Weekend's Arts in the Ville demonstrated how much traction this fabulous festival has gained in just four years. With over 1,500 people attending – up 33% on last year – locals and out-of-towners had the chance to talk to some 54 artists and watch them work, some in their studios, some in public venues like the community hall and the former Art Stop. There was plenty of art on sale too, and many people either bought work or filed away an artist's name for a future purchase.

As it did last year, the celebratory

atmosphere started a week before Labour Weekend, kicked off by Mitre 10's Art in the Garden, a Saturday event where visitors could view some of the pieces that would be on show during Arts in the Ville, have a

glass of wine and some crackers and cheese and listen to Ukelele Union strum some tunes and sing old favourites. On Friday 19 October, the night before Arts in the Ville opened, Helensville Women and Family Centre held a fantastic art auction.

The town, brightened considerably by the yarn bombing efforts of organisers Kura

Geere-Watson and Jo Dixey, was buzzing all weekend, with local businesses reporting brisk sales in food and drink. One highlight was The Hat Walk where, before a large, appreciative audience, locals modelled Myra Lloyd's gorgeous hats in the hall. Another was the Alphabet Hunt, the Helensville Art

Centre's contribution to Arts in the Ville. The hunt involved finding each letter of the alphabet, made from corrugated iron by local sculptor Jeff Thomson; the prize was a Jeff Thomson sculpture, in the form of a very large, corrugated iron mahoe leaf. Lured by the prospect of owning a Thomson art work, hundreds of people spent many hours trailing up and down Commercial and Mill roads looking for the letters, with some out-of-towners even returning to Helensville each day. In the end, 178 entries went into the draw, which was won by local six-year-old Abigail George, who went on the hunt with her mother Anita (Helensville Community

News compiler), her Nana Cushla and her brother Daniel. Drawing out the name of winner, on the spur of the moment Jeff decided to award prizes to two more entrants.

The organisers wish to thank everyone who took part and make special mention of the North West Business Association, who generously paid for the indispensable map, which guided people around the venues, and the map's designer Hannah Stoddart from the Uptown Business Association.

Question: Will there be an Arts in the Ville next year?

Answer: Put it in your diary. The hall, which provides the festival's central point, is already booked.



Sunday, 11 November, Armistice Centenary at Helensville, The Kaipara Memorial RSA will be commemorating the 100th anniversary of the signing of the Armistice that ended World War One on Sunday the 11th of November at 1100 hours. The club will hold a parade that will form up at 1045 hours between Countdown and the RSA and march to the Helensville War Memorial Hall Cenotaph, where at 1100 hours on the 11th day of the 11th month, exactly 100 years ago, a commemoration service will be held, including laying of wreaths and, as proclaimed by King George V, two minutes silence will be observed in memory of the 16,700 New Zealanders who died for their country in World War One, including the 35 soldiers from our district and who are remembered on the Cenotaphs at Parakai, Helensville and Kaukapakapa. (There are several names missing for some unknown reason).

The KMRSA holds dossiers on most of the men who are remembered on these Cenotaphs, with details of their name, number, rank, medals awarded, theatre of war, service records and home addresses prior to enlisting. Any relatives or people interested in viewing these dossiers should visit the KMRSA museum during opening hours at 49 Commercial Road, Helensville.

Families are encouraged to wear their relatives medals on their right chest and join the parade, Poppies will be available at the RSA. Medals should be worn by Service and ex-service personnel. The club will be open for lunch and refreshments after the ceremony, the museum will be open and a video "ANZAC War Horses" will be playing. Ralph Martin

In Kaukapakapa and Helensville Ralph Martin is well known as an energetic volunteer and community activist. He's turning 72 in November but shows no signs of slowing down - his fitness activities include walks up Pinchgut Road and tramping with the North Shore Tramping Club, where he's the membership



secretary (he recently walked with them from Mercer to Rangiriri). Not long ago he tramped in the Swiss and Austrian mountains and he travels overseas regularly with his partner Val -they've just been to Japan, Alaska and Vancouver and are next going to India.

Ralph has always been active. He and his four brothers grew up on a small dairy farm in Te Kopuru, just south of Dargaville and, because their father was badly injured in Crete during World War II, they all had to pitch in and help, quickly becoming accustomed to hard work. As well as doing farm chores, from the age of 14 Ralph worked on sheep and cattle farms in the district.

When he left school, he went to Auckland to take up a High Voltage Electrical Engineering apprenticeship, then completed a Diploma in Electrical Engineering, married Susan and did a brief stint at university. Impatient with the theory — Ralph liked the practical side of the work - he found a job working for the NZ Electricity Department. It was the first in a long career from 14 which took him quickly from hands-on to management. Having spent 46 years in the business there's not much he doesn't know about the ins and outs of such things as power stations and sub stations, transformers and transmission lines, cellphone tower installation, pylon installation, seismic proofing, high voltage upgrading and maintenance. From overseeing apprentices to managing budgets to writing reports for the government, Ralph's work was always varied and absorbing and carried with it a lot of responsibility.


His first community involvement, beginning when he was 20, was with the Jaycees, an organisation that in its heyday did great work with young people, training them in leadership roles (including running meetings and public speaking) and getting them involved in helping run events like *Top Town*, a travelling TV game show where teams representing New Zealand towns competed in a series of physical challenges. Ralph's 10 years with the Jaycees included roles as president, secretary and treasurer – a harbinger of things to come.

As father of three girls (tragically, his only son was premature and did not survive), Ralph first joined Pakuranga Heights' primary school committee and became the secretary, before moving on to chairing the school's first Board of Trustees. He then became a member of Edgewater College Board of Trustees. On leaving the Jaycees he joined Rotary, whom he was with for many years in various roles, like president and secretary, focussing on raising money for community projects.

While he had a challenging, enjoyable career Ralph missed the country life so, when the girls had left home, he moved to Kaukapakapa a few months before his retirement in 2009. "I'd always wanted to go back to my roots and have a little bit of land to play around with," he says. "I found a house with land and a pond I really liked, and I still do." The sign on Ralph Andrew Martin's gate, RAMS RETREAT, plays on his initials.

With a vege garden, two ewes, half a ram, Shaun- the other half is owned by a neighbour-Ralph is busy at home, but community work takes up a lot of his time. As well as acting as the neighbourhood support coordinator for his street, he spent four busy years on KARRA, the Kaukapakapa Residents and Ratepayers Association, four of them as the chairperson. Projects he's proud of leading in that time include a landscape architectdesigned development plan, public meet-the-candidate election meetings, clearing and planting the reserve and lowering the speed limit through the town. He's a local Justice of the Peace, running clinics at the Helensville Plunket Rooms on Saturday mornings and helps with South Kaipara Rotary projects, like the new orchard at Parakai Primary. His main effort is with the Helensville Citizen's Advice Bureau (CAB). After six years as chairperson he's now 'just a volunteer' locally but has a further role as a member of the Auckland CAB Board, a body whose main role is to provide funding for the 31 bureaux in the Auckland Council area.

And that's not all. In his 'spare time' Ralph works as an odd job man for elderly women in Helensville, cleaning out gutters, gardening, painting and mending, for a nominal fee. Recently, he says, he cut a hole in a railing for a cat too fat to jump over the top. All in a day's work. Ralph is one of those people, then, who exemplify the notion that Helensville is held together by its volunteers. What motivates him? "I enjoy it, "he says. "I like doing practical things, it keeps me busy. I've been very lucky in my life and helping people out has always been something I like to do."

Management Changes at Kaipara Medical Centre

The Kaipara Medical Centre has begun the search for a new Practice Manager to lead its team through the next stage of growth and development.

The new role is being created after an external review of the Centre identified the need for a full-time manager to oversee the operation of the busy GP clinic.

Kaipara Medical Centre Chair, Dianne Kidd says with so much growth in the northwest Rodney area it's important the Centre is able to expand and cater to its diverse population.

A recent Health Needs Assessment report found the South Kaipara has an ageing population and many more young families are moving to the area. The demographics are now 20% Mâori including the five marae of Ngâti Whâtua o Kaipara.

"Our new Practice Manager will be someone with sound management experience, the enthusiasm and confidence to seek out new business opportunities and the ability to establish our reputation as a leading provider of health to a largely rural community."

As a result two part-time roles have been disestablished, those of Richard Reid as Business Manager and John Issott as the centre's Administration Manager.

Dianne Kidd says "both men are well known to our patients and we are immensely grateful for their years of dedicated and committed service to the health of our community."

John has worked for the Kaipara Medical Centre for 13 years. He will continue his long-standing commitment to local health through his other part-time role as Administration Manager at the Helensville District Health Trust and his many years of volunteer service with the local St John Ambulance Area Committee.

Richard Reid will likely be a familiar face for a while yet while the transition to the new Practice Manager is completed.

Dianne Kidd says the growth of the local GP service has been significant over the years from a sole-charge rural doctor around 50-plus years ago, to a large medical practice with eight doctors and 16 other nursing and support staff servicing over 6000 registered patients.

She says one of the rewards of this new job will be uplifting the health of the South Kaipara community, especially for Mâori and other ethnic minorities.

Meanwhile, plans for the building of a pharmaceutical dispensary within the Kaipara Medical Centre building have been put on hold until the Practice Manager role is filled.

Applications for the role close in the middle of November.



Bridge to Hope

Bridge to Hope, the suicide prevention awareness established Helensville in 2015. continues to support families and individuals. The team of volunteers. coordinated by Marie Takefala Adlam, attend the Christian Life Centre in Commercial Road. They're grateful for their church's support, which includes provision of a



designated office in a building beside the church, and access to the church building itself for workshops. Everyone is welcome to take advantage of the service, whether or not they are Christian.

Marie is in the office from 3pm - 5pm on Wednesdays and support numbers are displayed on the office window. Other volunteers help out by distributing flyers and attending community events in their bright yellow Bridge to Hope tee shirts. The team participate in Christmas parades and meet up monthly and pray for families who have lost loved ones to suicide. Bridge to Hope suicide prevention walks are held in Helensville and the team are very grateful for the solid support they receive from front liners. Parakai Pools and their families.

Marie, who wants to let the community know about the free service provided by Bridge to Hope, explains that her expertise for the coordinator's role comes from lived experience and from her suicide prevention and intervention training, provided by the 1degree workshops, safeTALK and ASIST, run by Caroline

As well as organising free workshops for the community, Marie assists people by helping them find the right support, which may be from a GP, or Waitemata District Health Board's Manu Foto. Other help available is through a free text or call to 1737, a government-funded counselling service.

"My sincerest condolences go out to family or friends who have lost a loved one through suicide. Although I am not a counsellor or a psychologist, I am here to listen to you and can put you onto people who are qualified and more than happy to help," says Marie. "It's important to start a conversation about suicide. A meeting of family or friends can be very effective when someone is feeling low and needing support."

Shelly Beach foreshore upgrade

A massive \$1.5 million project to upgrade Shelly Beach is well underway. To fight erosion, a new seawall and five groynes to modify sea currents and wave energy to help trap sand on the beach are being constructed. Additional sand from the Kaipara Harbour



is being placed between the groynes and there will be a new walkway along the shore to connect the playground and parking areas

Around 3200-square metres of mangroves have been removed, giving the beach a very different look. The large structure at the south end of the reserve resembles a sound shell but is there to house machinery and other equipment being used in the upgrade.

Ian McLean from Birds New Zealand has said that the banded rail, kingfisher, and Australasian bittern will be adversely affected by losing cover that enables them to hide from predators and by losing feeding territory, but oystercatchers and godwits that use mudflats will benefit from the increase in area of open mud and sand flats for wading and feeding.

So, the Rimu team on Ag Day researched some alternatives and discovered beeswax wraps were easy and cost effective to make. They provide a more sustainable way to wrap sandwiches, biscuits and fruit, etc. and beeswax is reusable, so it doesn't harm our marine life.

Here is how we made them;

- Cut pieces of cotton fabric to size
- 2. Melt beeswax into an electric frying pan
- 3. Soak our pieces in the wax
- 4. Wait to dry
- Use them.






Yvonne Rust: Maverick Spirit, by Theresa Sjoquist

Helensville has many artists, as we see by the fabulous variety of work on display each year during Labour Weekend's Arts in the Ville. Ask any of them about the source of their inspiration and one thing they'll talk about is the people who have been important to them in their lives. The late Helensville artist Noeleen Healey, a wonderful woman who. as a teacher and artist, inspired many people, was herself greatly



inspired by incomparable potter, painter, teacher and mentor, the late Yvonne Rust, describing her in an interview as someone who "constantly sits on my shoulder".

Rust was a big personality, a woman who influenced everyone who crossed her path, artist or not. When I met her in the early 1970s she was in full flight, combining her two great loves, making beautiful pottery and running workshops from her studio in Whangarei. I remember her telling me firmly that if I wasn't a potterit was time I got started. That was not my calling but, because she looked me in the eye and called me Chum (the name she gave everyone), it really felt like she had my best interests at heart.

Rust's huge and enduring influence on artists and craftspeople in New Zealand is painstakingly detailed in Helensville writer Theresa Sjoquist's biography 'Yvonne Rust: Maverick Spirit', published by David Ling in 2011. It's a great read, beginning with stories of Rust's childhood in the Far North during the Depression years, following her every move as she grew into the towering figure she became. The liberal use of Rust's own words, taken from various attempts at getting her story down on paper, adds depth to the narrative and the generous photographs of people and places, as well as of Rust's work, provide fascinating visual illustration. If you're at all interested in the arts it's a book that, having read it once, you'll want to keep going back to for another hit
