

Shelly Beach Upgrade News

We know that some of you will be travelling out to Shelly Beach over the summer months so we are posting this update.

We met with the contractor and held a discussion on site the other week, Masons have produced Plans showing the extent of the work site over both January and February. See below.

All other areas of the beach outside those shown in the Plans will be open to the public, with fencing down.



Masons have advised the intent is to work on Groyne 2 during January, with a manned crossing point where materials are delivered across the boat ramp. However, they note if the boat ramp is too busy to manage the vehicle crossings safely they will work on Groyne 3 to avoid this.



Rochelle Gillespie had always had a hankering for a rural life and three years ago, after she found the perfect place online - a beautiful, 120-year old relocated house on a couple of acres - moved from Waiatarua to Helensville with husband John and their three school-age children, Local connections quickly formed through meeting the families of their

children's school mates and through Rochelle's community involvement, which includes positions on the Kaipara College PTA, Helensville Women and Family Centre, the Kia Timata Ano Women's Refuge and work for the Helensville District Health Trust.

For John, who is head of TVNZ's News and Current Affairs, country living is the perfect antidote to the stresses and responsibilities of a high-powered urban job.

Raised in Christchurch, he and his siblings were encouraged to choose their own path although, John cautions, "Dad was a dentist and, with all the horror stories we heard, we weren't going there". Despite "sharing the performing gene" with his twin brother, sister and parents, John had always wanted to write. After moving to Australia and earning his way in a variety of odd jobs, he eventually opted to study journalism, mostly television-based, at

Charles Sturt University in Sydney. Graduating with a BA, he worked in radio for a while before returning to Christchurch to take up a position as a journalist at Canterbury Television (CTV), an independent station which had just been established. In that job he met Rochelle "across a crowded newsroom" and worked his way up to the position of news editor.

In the 20 plus years John has worked in New Zealand television he has had many roles. When TVNZ bought out CTV he and Rochelle moved to Auckland, where she found work as a reporter for Independent Radio News, and he became a producer on the Breakfast Show, which began in 1997. Later, Rochelle was a weather presenter on Breakfast for two years.

John's other jobs at TVNZ have included researcher and associate producer on the current affairs show Assignment, where he enjoyed working with and learning from the likes of Kerryanne Evans, Rob Harley and Rod Vaughan. He was also head of daily shows (e.g. Tonight, One News and Breakfast) and executive producer on Fair Go, a position he loved. "I worked on that show for five years with a very good team – they made the hard look easy. Kevin Milne was the presenter and doing stories about people preying on the vulnerable made me become quite cynical, but the show helped a lot of people. It still does. The great thing was that it was advocacy journalism - Kevin taught me you could take a stand."

While his team gather and deliver content online and on air, as Head of News and Current Affairs John has overall responsibility for staff and programmes, with tasks that include making sure programmes are hitting their ratings targets and looking ahead at content and strategy. The big challenge for television news now is that the landscape, which was very straight forward when John began his career, has changed hugely in a short time and the competition with online news feeds is fierce. "I do have a sense that journalism is under siege, both here and around the world. Print and television are less popular than they were when I began my career. Because most people see or hear the news during the day the challenge is to make television's presentation of it relevant."

John loves his job. "Like most jobs it has its stresses, but there's a buzz with news and producing it is a lot of fun. I like the team and I like the craft of visual storytelling; both the emotional and the intellectual sides of it. The audience needs to be able to trust that you're fair and balanced too – I think that integrity is really precious. I don't see a lesser place for journalism despite the efforts of Donald Trump and others to attack and discredit it. In New Zealand now there's a greater distrust of institutions, including media, but I'm confident that the truth comes out."

Away from the office John is a keen musician, playing guitar, banjo and ukulele, recently teaming up for regular jam sessions with local music guru Nick Roberts with their band The Hired Hand. As father of three busy kids his chauffeuring services are in hot demand ("they all want to go somewhere different") and he spends as much time in the weekend in the garden as he can manage, enjoying the chance to relax among the plants.

John says he and his family have fallen on their feet coming to Helensville. "It's an amazing community. The people are fantastic – open and honest and friendly. There's something very real about living here. We're very lucky."





Venue History & Details:

The sculpture gardens, which opened in 2008, have been developed in conjunction with Kaipara Coast Plant Centre which has been owned and operated by David and Geraldine Bayly from this site since 1988. The Sculpture Trail is open to the public 364 days a year and features a 1km garden and forest trail showcasing more than 40 sculptures by emerging and established New Zealand and international artists.

The trail passes through a rural landscape with a mix of grassy slopes, ponds, wetland area, formal gardens, native bush, an orchard, pine planting and has views to the Kaipara Harbour.

Although very easy to walk along, the gravel pathway isn't suitable for wheel chairs or walking frames.

The opening event on Sunday, December 9, 2018, will be a unique opportunity to be the first to experience the Kaipara Coast Sculpture Gardens Exhibition 2019 and celebrate its launch with the artists. Dealing with feelings

Anxiety, depression and stress are constantly thrown around in our modern world. But what do they mean for young people?

The Rimu team at Helensville School have been inquiring into dealing with feelings. The mental health statistics in New Zealand are shocking so we need to learn how we can navigate our way through life.

There are many things you can do to help yourself and young people deal with their mental health in a healthy and positive way.

- Talk to someone you trust a friend, parent, teacher (a problem shared is a problem halved)
- Exercise
- Have enough sleep
- Take time out to just relax
- Limit screen time.

Emotions affect us all in different ways. When feeling angry try these simple steps:

- Talk to someone
- Go for a walk
- Try breathing exercises -with each breath blow your anger away
- Count backwards from 10, then do it again, and again

Is anxiety stopping you from living your life to the fullest? Try some of these things;

- Do sport that is calming enough to keep your mind focused on the sport, not what you're stressing over.
- Follow the 3-3-3 rule (look around you, name three things you see, three things you hear and, finally, move three parts of your body).

We found out that everyone's mental health is important and sometimes just 'sucking it up' isn't the right strategy. So talk to the young people in your life today, a simple chat could make all the difference.



Topp Country: a culinary journey through New Zealand with the Topp Twins

Text by Arani Cuthbert and Jools Topp Published by Diva Books, Auckland, 2018 Reviewed by Helen Martin



Never let it be said that the Topp Twins are one-trick ponies. Just when you think they must have exhausted their range they do something new – this time producing a brilliant 260-page book based on their award-winning television series, Topp Country. The names of the many others who also contributed to the book's collaboration appear in the acknowledgements.

Why shower 'Topp Country: a culinary journey through New Zealand with the

Topp Twins' with such unequivocal praise? For a start, this is no cheap production. It feels substantial and looks beautiful, filled with gorgeous, well-designed images of the food, land and people Jools and Lynda showcased in the first two series. The Dames feature a lot too; alongside their hosts from around Aotearoa New Zealand as they help prepare and serve fabulous dishes fashioned from home-grown, home gathered produce; together in photos that go from their childhood to the present day; and in their comic roles as Ken and Ken, the Bowling Ladies, Camp Mother and Camp Leader.

There's never a dull moment. An incisive Foreword by Colin Hogg, who has known the Topps since their Grey Lynn days when "you could spot their place by the tractor parked outside",

clearly set-out recipes, background stories about the Topps and the Kiwis they meet along the way, snippets of supporting information and Ken's poems provide a rich and varied smorgasbord of content, presented in such a way that you can dip into the book or read it cover to cover. Rather than take a linear approach, the narrative appears in sections under the umbrella 'For the love of', with stories on food-specific topics like 'venison' and 'poultry' and themes such as 'decadence' (where crayfish and chocolate have their moment), 'spice' and 'garden'. While there's an underlying theme that promotes ethical food production, the tone is one of unmitigated pleasure. Without having to read a word, when you pick up this book you can see it's full of joy and laughter.

I bought my copy from Jools, who lives at South Head and was selling them from a stall at the Kaukapakapa Market. As she signed it, she chatted about her wonderful family, her horses, her enjoyment making the Topp Country programmes. What a bonus! The book is available in stores, including Helensville Paper Plus.

Johannes (Hans) Van Duyn

(March 7, 1937 - November 2, 2018)

Johannes (Hans) Van Duyn and his twin brother Jan were in The Hague, Netherlands. Growing up in WWII-occupied Holland they endured hardship, missing out on a normal childhood and education, and started working on fishing boats when they were 13. Hans married the love of his life, Gerda, in 1957. They were to celebrate their 61st wedding anniversary in late November.



Together Hans and Gerda Mum and Dad welcomed

Diane, Hans Junior and Rene into the world. During this time Hans became the Netherlands judo middleweight champion. Keen to give his children the best childhood he could provide, Hans followed his friend John Houniet, whom he had met while doing his compulsory army service, and moved the family to New Zealand, arriving in November 1965. Hans often told his children that, after spending the first night in their new country at the Takapuna campground, he walked along Takapuna beach. The kids were paddling in the water and he looked across at Rangitoto Island said, "we're in paradise." That opinion of New Zealand never changed.

By working three jobs, in 1966, he purchased his first home in Takapuna. He then built an unpermitted top story on the house, where he set up a judo school. In 1966 he and Gerda added to the family by adopting 10-day-old Simon. In 1971 the family grew again to welcome Helen and in 1973 Lisa was adopted at age two, completing the family unit.


Hans continued to achieve in judo, becoming the NZ Heavyweight Champion and training others. One of his proudest moments was when he was the NZ flag bearer at the World Champs. Later he discovered there was money to be made in the construction industry and the judo school was closed to make way for the beginnings of Eurovision Housemovers, the family business that still runs today.

With Gerda by his side, Hans and his sons worked together and built up a thriving business. They eventually made the move to Helensville. Diane became the secretary and her husband Colin joined the company. Seeing a need for affordable housing in Helensville and Parakai, Hans defied the odds and the Council to move homes to the area, many of which are still there today. Hans became an energetic Helensville Borough Councillor in the early 1980s. He became well known in the Helensville community for his generous nature, donating the moving of the Helensville courthouse and museum buildings and donating the youth club building in Awaroa Rd to the community. He was honoured to be named a life member of the Helensville Historical Society. Through all of this, he remained dedicated to the family business, staying very involved well past retirement.

As immigrants, Gerda and Hans missed their families terribly, but soon their friends became like close family. After grandchildren started arriving from 1983 Hans became Poppa. After Gerda, his grandchildren and later his great grandchildren were the lights of his life. It was devastating when the family lost Simon in a car crash in 1984, but the tragedy brought everyone even closer together, as they are today.

At his funeral Hans was celebrated as a man who valued his family above all else and who instilled in them all a work ethic that has carried on through the generations. He was legendary in his generosity, helping people in their times of need and giving amazing opportunities to people who had never had any. A policeman once told a family member he was convinced Hans had saved his life by jumping into a violent attack and fighting off several men. He would fight passionately for his values and for others he believed weren't getting a fair deal - councils, cops, lawyers - and was never afraid to keep pushing forward in his efforts, despite the odds. He loved everything about New Zealand and his homes always had a flagpole to proudly fly the flag he loved.

The family wish to thank Te Waru Hill, who organised a beautiful karanga and feathered cloak for Hans, those who sent their love, condolences and support and everyone who attended the funeral.
