

Helensville Museum needs our help

In July, a report in Stuff online and Norwest News notified the public that Helensville Museum was closed for a month because its collection is endangered by a recent escalation of borer and other pests threatening the collection of artefacts in its

four heritage buildings.

Given that the Museum's mission is "To promote, understand. and preserve the history and heritage of the district, and its intrinsic values" this was alarming news to those entrusted with the care of its thousands precious taonga. As vice-president Leigh Bosch explains, "We are not the owners, we are the kaitiaki, the

caretakers, and it's our job to look after the buildings and everything in them for the community. If we don't deal with this now, it's going to get worse." Committee member Robyn Stewart agrees. "As well as borer affecting timber objects, we're losing textiles to fabric moth and paper and photographic archives to silverfish. Most of our artefacts have been impacted."

Once the extent of the threat was realised, Leigh and Robyn moved quickly into action, beginning by researching best practice. Preservation of museum collections is a global issue and there is a wealth of online information on the topic. The material provided by London's Victoria and Albert Museum, for example, makes for very useful reading. They have also contacted several museums directly, including in England, America and Australia. "What we're up against is small fry compared to what they have to do." says Leigh.

The material of the artefact determines

its treatment. Robyn has been to Warkworth Museum to learn the correct way to store textiles and the buildings are being fumigated. Current thinking is that the old way of controlling borer using kerosene is not ideal, because, while it slows adults

down, it doesn't penetrate through to the eggs. Freezing is the way to go. Hours spent on the phone looking for refrigerated container resulted in Royal Wolf providing one at a much-needed 40% discount and Linton Ivicevich from Truck and Crane in Stewart Street, Helensville, offered to pick it up and return it free, a further big saving. Leigh and Robyn put together shelves for

the container and Dave Swale generously offered to house it in his yard over the road, putting down gravel to keep it clear of puddles. The container's position impacts the Kaipara Classic Car Club, whose 3-phase power is being used, and Rodney Meat Processors, whose space is also being encroached, but both businesses are happy to contribute.

Sound wooden artefacts and furniture are being packed in acid-free tissue and polythene, sealed with tape, then frozen in the container, with the temperature gradually reduced to -28 degrees. Objects already splitting must be treated individually by hand with a pesticide, as freezing would split them further. Because framed photographs can't be frozen, they also must be individually hand-treated. "It's a juggling act," says Robyn. "We trying to be environmentally friendly and take minimal risk with the pesticide while making sure the pests are killed."

Having seen the Stuff article, Auckland Museum's Collection Care Department sent professional conservationists Siren Deluxe and Georgia Miller to offer invaluable help in the form of both storage containers and advice. "Our job is preventive conservation of a collection of 4.5 million objects at Auckland Museum and we have a lot of experience in pest management and environmental control, all those factors that make things slowly degrade," Siren explained. "We can demonstrate ways to mitigate problems like borer, mould, silverfish and rodents, all of which are a problem here. We're going to help particularly with the textiles and monitoring."

Siren pointed out that, while the old buildings are difficult to control, the archive room is a real asset because it can be controlled. "She and Georgia told us we're doing everything right to bring the situation under control was. They've provided an ongoing Pest Management Plan for us and will continue to support us in any way they can," says Leigh.

Ongoing support from Auckland Museum will be provided.

Textile experts Tracey Wedge and Mary Stevens came from Matakohe Kauri Museum to help remove fragile garments from mannequins and demonstrate how to best store and care for them. They also helped with correctly identifying and dating the garments. They will also be providing ongoing assistance where required.

"Due to advice from Matakohe and Auckland museums we are having to freeze a lot more than we had anticipated. We also have to give the museum a thorough scrub down - the bugs thrive on each other and, of course, we can't monitor new issues unless we are completely clean to start with. We're going to need people to help us clean," Leigh explains.

It's a time-consuming business - wrapping a single desk takes half an hour- and Leigh and Robyn would dearly like more community help. In the late 1880's the Kaukapakapa community needed a larger public hall, there being prior to this a combined school/ library/hall building. Contention arose as to its location as the village had developed in two distinct portions - north and south Kaukapakapa. A compromise was reached and in 1890 a new hall was built on land donated by the Henley family, midway between the two areas. The bad news being this was extremely flood prone. Many years and many floods later, the Hall had fallen into disrepair and come to the attention of the Rodney Council, which recommended its closure. Once again the community rallied, and twenty years ago in 1999, both the hall and the library crossed the road to their present position at the heart of Kaukapakapa. It's now five years since the library was reopened in conjunction with the Kaukapakapa Village Market, every third Sunday of the month. 

Kerry and Doug King

Newcomers to Helensville will know Kerry and Doug King as Barfoot and Thompson real estate agents, but as Kerry was born here and Doug came when he was 13, people who have been in the district a long time will also know them as a couple who have been involved in a great variety of local activities over the years.

Kerry and three of her four brothers were born at Malolo House. Her mother Pauline and father Stan Ross were both from local railway families and lived in railway houses in Awaroa Road as children. As a couple, for 42 years Pauline and Stan owned the house in Awaroa Road Kerry and her brothers grew up in. Pauline, now 90, still lives in the road, although not in the same house. "Almost my whole life has been in Awaroa Road," Kerry says. "The first house Doug and I bought was there."

Kerry recalls a wonderful childhood, with plenty of neighbouring kids to play with and a close school friend Barb, who eventually became a much-loved sister-in-law after marrying Kerry's brother Greg. "Helensville had everything. As a family we went camping at Shelly Beach. We'd fish for eels in the Awaroa Creek, ride bikes and horses and hang out in the neighbourhood." When her brothers were out deer hunting, shooting and fishing, Kerry preferred being home with her mother. "I was never allowed to go duck shooting because the language wasn't 'suitable' for a young girl. I remember that feeding us all was always colossal when Mum cooked ducks for us for dinner she'd cook six at a time, because the boys and Dad all had one each, and she and I would have half."

Kerry went to Helensville Primary and Kaipara College, played

hockey, then played and coached netball for several years. Doug and Kerry got together in their early teens and have been together ever since. As teenagers they hung out at the Barbecue Milk-bar on the corner of Awaroa and Commercial Roads. "It had a jukebox, milkshakes - it was the happening place. There were basketball dances in the Oddfellows Hall. We did Scottish dancing and went to the movies at the local theatre on a Friday and Saturday night." Once there were children, as a family the Kings went fishing in their boat, played sport and took part in Cubs, Scouts and Venturers. Doug ran the projector at the local theatre for a few years when the kids were teenagers because he loves movies. Their sport of choice is now bowls, where they've had a lot of success as members of the Helensville Bowling Club Business House team.

At first, Kerry and Doug had separate jobs - she did a brief stint in a city typing pool, then switched to a job as receptionist in Helensville because she was homesick - "I'd see the Kaipara dairy truck and burst into tears. It took all my willpower not to knock on its door and say, 'take me home." The job she left when she was pregnant with their first child was at the BNZ, right next to her birthplace, Malolo house. Doug worked first as a mechanic at McLeod Motors, next became a railway mechanic, then bought a digger and did part time digging and trenching. They eventually began working together when, as parents of three college-aged children, they became owners of a chocolate factory, operating out of Oddfellows Hall. After 11 years there they sold the business and Doug went on to buy a stainless-steel manufacturing business, which he ran for a further 10 years

Working as a receptionist for a real estate company in Kaipara Court once the kids had grown up and left home gave Kerry the impetus to forge a career for herself as a real estate agent. She found the job interesting, not least because it's so varied, and studied for her professional papers. She began working at Barfoot and Thompson in Kumeu, then twelve years ago moved to the company's Helensville branch. Doug soon followed. For some time now, they have worked together, self-employed but under the Barfoot and Thompson umbrella.

With Pauline and Stan the original Ross settlers in Helensville, the Ross family are now into their fifth generation in the area. "My brothers and Doug and I all stayed in Helensville when we grew up because we didn't need to go anywhere else, we just loved being here," Kerry says. "I've grown up in this town and I know the lifestyle it's given us. I love young families coming into the town and, because I know it so well, as a real estate agent I can tell people about the schools and how bringing up a family here is so much easier than the city. It's the smallness of the community. You get to know the parents. I pick up the grandkids from school and can talk to the mums. A lot are girls who were friends with my kids and it's lovely to see they're still here and still part of Helensville. Doug would never go anywhere else either. It's given him everything he's wanted."

Up-healthing Your Porridge

Porridge for breakfast is such a staple in the cooler months and is a great healthy alternative to a lot of the high sugary processed cereals that are on the super market shelves.

So, if you are going to eat porridge, do you know there are a few tricks to make it even healthier?

Soaking

Soaking your oats overnight before cooking them can be beneficial as this helps breakdown the phytic acid (which is present in all grains, nuts, seeds, beans etc) and can be irritating to our gut. Just pour water over the oats and let them soak in it overnight, then just cook as usual in the morning, adding more water if necessary. Cooking in a saucepan on the stovetop is healthier than the microwave option.

Type of Oats

Going for plain oats is the best option. Avoiding oats that are flavoured is best, as these usually contain added sugar, flavours, additives and preservatives. Go for the plain oats (wholegrain and organic is best) and add your own flavourings.

Additions

This is where you can get creative. Add in:

- Nuts & seeds
- LSA (linseed, sunflower seeds, almonds all pre-ground up)
- Fruit (go for fresh instead of canned) berries, banana, stewed apple
- Yoghurt or coconut yoghurt on top
- Buckwheat groats or quinoa flakes (added before cooking)
- Cinnamon or nutmeg


