

From home brewers to NZ champions

Joseph and Christina Wood's Mill Road company Liberty Brewing has been judged our country's best brewery after winning 14 medals at the prestigious October industry event, The Brewers Guild of New Zealand Beer Awards. With world class international judges, the awards are regarded globally as among the most prestigious accolades a brewer can win. Gold medals were awarded for their beers Halo Pilsner, Yakima Monster, Oh Brother, Hoptical Illusion and Knife Party and for their Prohibition Porter. Liberty's other medals included five silvers and three bronzes and the trophy for best packaging for a range rebrand. It's an amazing achievement, especially because this tiny company with only eight staff, including the Woods, has gone from boutique homebrew supplies business to national champion in just ten years.

Joseph and Christina both came to Helensville with their families as children and both attended Kaipara College. Christina remembers working at Fay's Takeaways on Commercial Road since she was ten, a business established by her grandmother Fay and later bought by her parents. Joseph had developed an early interest in home brewing and the couple, married and living in New Plymouth, bought the web-based Liberty Home Brew Supply Shop largely as a means of sourcing fresh ingredients for his home brew. "Joseph's created his own recipes from Day One and, because we had the home brewing supplies first, we got to learn a lot about the properties and the taste profiles of ingredients," says Christina. "We sold all the different hops so we got to see what they were all like, and because of that knowledge base he could create amazing recipes."

After they'd bought a house in New Plymouth, and with two children to wrangle, in 2010 the Woods set up a certified brewery in the garage, starting with a 100-litre batch and increasing the volume to the point where, the garage outgrown, they contracted Tuatara Brewery in Paraparaumu to brew their beer. "Our first batch was 4000litres of Yakima



Monster and it was utterly terrifying, because before that we'd been hand bottling and hand labelling in the garage at home." From the first Tuatara batch they won their first gold medal at the New Zealand Beer Awards and began developing more beers they could mass produce. "That first award reassured us that we were good for a roof over our heads," says Christina.

Offers from people wanting to capitalise on Joseph's brewing and Christina's management skills led to their briefly teaming up with Kumeu's Hallertau Brewery to create The Beer Fountain, built by Joseph and responsible for brewing the Hallertau and Liberty beer brands. It was just two years before Liberty outgrew that space and, moving back to Helensville, Joseph and Christina established their brewery in the Mill Road lane they still occupy, and from where they currently turn out many litres of their sought-after beers.

As well as brewing beer for the general market and seasonal beer festivals, the Woods give locals a chance to socialise over a craft beer at their Liberty Taproom, just across the road from their plant, on Fridays

(2pm – 7pm), Saturdays (12pm – 6pm) and Sundays (2pm - 6pm). As anyone who frequents the Taproom will tell you, the place is humming, and the beer is brilliant. "We set it up because we wanted to make people aware of us and we wanted a beer education room to encourage safer drinking habits. The emphasis is on drinking quality rather than quantity, about appreciating the flavour and the effort put into it. It's also about supporting local - keeping your money onshore and in NZ," says Christina, who's listed on the Liberty website as 'CEO, CFO, CIO, Chairperson, Secretariat and all-round Superwoman.' "Our business is husband and wife owned, and I'm really stoked to have come from Fay's Takeaways to helping create this roaring beast. Being officially NZ's best brewery is something to be proud of."

New Owner for Kaipara Medical Centre

Kaipara Medical Centre has a new owner who is committed to supporting a thriving GP practice that best serves the needs of the growing South Kaipara population.

For the last five years Kaipara Medical Centre has been owned collectively by two local GPs, the Waitemata District Health Board and the Helensville District Health Trust who had a 50% shareholding. But after a change in circumstances for the two shareholding doctors, and a desire by the Health Trust to return to its core purpose of providing state-of-the-art health-related facilities, it was decided that selling the medical centre was in the best interests of all involved.

The new owner is ProCare, a co-operative network of 170 GP practices across Auckland. Health Trust Chairman Rory MacGillycuddy says "when we went looking for a new buyer, we weren't simply going to sell to the highest bidder, the new owner also had to prove a commitment to this community - to both our staff and our patients." Mr MacGillycuddy says ProCare was the preferred option because of its assurance to keep current staff employed and for agreeing to keep the medical centre as a Very Low Cost Access Practice, a designation based on the demographics of the population which means it must keep its fees low. ProCare officially takes over the running of the business on 29 November but says patients should notice very little change. "Our priority is to firstly listen to staff and patients to find out what is working well and what could work better so we can work out where the opportunities for growth and improvement are," says ProCare Network director Dr Francesco Lentini. Dr Lentini takes on the chair role at Kaipara Medical Centre once the new ownership takes effect. Dr Lentini has worked in rural GP practices before so has an understanding of the unique needs of working in such a location where patients can sometimes be isolated and have difficulty accessing healthcare, and where it can be harder to recruit and retain staff.

Kaipara Medical Centre has been a member of the ProCare network of GP clinics, so has had a long-standing relationship for many years, but this is the first time ProCare has ventured into the ownership of a practice. "This is an exciting new area of business for us and as such we're committed to making sure the Kaipara Medical Centre becomes a flagship for what can be achieved given the right support, governance and experience," says Dr Lentini. With Kaipara Medical Centre sold and the recent closure of its operations at Te Whare Oranga o Parakai, the Helensville District Health Trust will now focus on the redevelopment of its health campus on the corner of Commercial Road and Porter Crescent, including an expansion of the highlysuccessful Helensville Birthing Centre. Rory MacGillycuddy says the Health Trust wants the community to have confidence that by leaving the Kaipara Medical Centre in such good hands it can now put its energies and resources into creating facilities that will best meet the health needs of the growing population for the next 20-30 years. "We want our health facilities to be the envy of small towns right around New Zealand and this is the next step in allowing us to make that happen."





Janice McMurdo

Known in Helensville as a caterer. Janice McMurdo is now also an author, having recently published a novella set partly in South Head. Growing up on a South Head dairy farm and with parents deeply connected to the local community - her father Clive was involved with the Kaipara Dairy Company, her mother Joyce with the Women's Division Federated Farmers - Janice has a strong local pedigree. Clive McMurdo was raised



on a farm in Fordyce Road, her mother's parents Johanna and Malcolm Sheffield were Pokeno farmers before buying and living in Helen's Villa in Nelson St, later moving to a Garfield Rd villa. Like many of her generation, Janice was born at Malolo House. As a child she and three of her four siblings rode their horses to Waioneke school with two on each horse, no saddle, just a surcingle and a sheepskin. By the time brother Tom was born there was a bus to take them to school on the rough, gravelled road.

Janice loved life on the farm. For a time, her father was President of the A&P Show and she was always very proud when her calf won an award. "I always had a pet calf for Calf Club. Every night after milking I'd train my calf to walk on a lead. We had sacks for covers to make their coats shiny and one day I got into big trouble for mixing up about 10 eggs and covering my calf in the mixture," she says. She loved riding horses, and got into trouble there too when, after her father and others established the South Head Golf Club on the McMurdo farm, she did some damage to a green by riding a horse across it.

As a shy, gawky teenager she didn't't enjoy her time at Helensville District High School and left when she was 15, opting to stay on the family farm for a year before moving in with her grandparents in Garfield Rd. "Helensville in the late 1950s was so quiet," Janice says. "There was nothing to do, nowhere to go. Mum got me a job at Screatons, but the moment I turned 18 I went psych nursing at Kingseat and lived in the nurses' home. I was only there for six months before I left and went waitressing."

Janet's life as a young adult included time spent as a solo parent in Mt Roskill and marked the beginning of her interest in catering. "As a kid I wasn't interested in food, I just saw it as fuel, but I started getting interested after I invited friends for dinner. There were no good recipes about, so I just used my imagination and the meal was delicious." Moving to Perth she bought and ran a lunch bar for five years then, worn down by long hours and frequent break-ins, and with her children now adults, she returned to New Zealand.

After a time, she moved back to Helensville as part owner, with John Perry, of the Regent Theatre. "At first, we lived in the cinema, then we built an apartment upstairs and I ran a café from the foyer. After equipping it and adding a kitchen and a cool room,

I added twenty cinema seats, a large screen and a DVD projector and held a popular series of dinner and movies every Saturday night. The Café Regent featured musicians, poets, parties and weddings, and was very popular with the local music scene. It was an interesting time and I learnt such a lot." After seven years Janice moved out, bought the shop in Commercial Road she later named Food for Thought and set up a catering business, Onion Jam Creative Foods. She acted on her interest in therapy, training in the techniques of hypnotherapy and Emotional Freedom Technique (E.F.T), which focus on personal empowerment through release from fears and phobias, addictions, stress-related illnesses and pain. She also studied the Hawaiian healing practice Ho'oponopono and now offers therapy.

Janice's lively story The Bird's Nest, which is about a man on-the-run in the South Head bush in the 1950s, started to form while she was at The Regent and, although modest about her writing talent, she persevered, first publishing a 30,000-word version, then re-writing and re-publishing it, adding 10,000 more words (cover design by local graphic artists Jacky Pieper and Georgia Black). "When I was young, I wanted to run away and live in the bush, so I suppose the idea came from there. I used to go deer stalking with my father and brother and I wanted to write an adventure story about the South Head of my childhood – the bush down Wilson Rd was so pretty and everyone knew it as The Bird's Nest." Driven by her father's work ethic, Janice has already begun writing her second book, which is again set locally and this time centres on a young girl and a Dalmatian man.

From Penk's Pen

Ganging Up on Kiwis

There are not many human needs more basic than the safety of life and limb. It's inherent in our collective psyche, as a species, to wish to preserve ourselves and each other against harm.

While I'm firmly against governments interfering unduly in the lives of private citizens, I'm equally firmly in favour of the state helping to protect its communities by all reasonable means.

In twenty-first century New Zealand, a key threat to public safety is the operation of criminal gangs. Unfortunately, their influence and power is growing. In fact, the past two years have seen an increase of 25.9% in the number patched gang members around our nation.

In case there's any doubt about the sinister intent of such groups, gang leaders have been upfront about their intention not to comply with firearms laws as recently changed by Parliament. If it is good enough for law-abiding citizens to surrender their weapons – almost invariably held for innocent purposes such as competition and pest control – then it certainly should be good enough for those already underground.

As the Police Minister has admitted, the distribution of methamphetamine in our communities is an increasing problem because of gang members. Despite this acknowledgement from the Beehive, there is no apparent increase in the number of gang members being prosecuted.

A statement like this highlights a problem that demands an answer and desperately requires a solution. After all, how can a government reduce criminal gang numbers if it fails to prosecute the members breaking the law? It's worth noting that the Government's claim that the increase is in line with the 1,200 offenders deported to New Zealand from Australia has been proven false by the Police Minister himself, with his admission that only 22 patched gang members had been deported from across the Tasman to our fair shores.

We must do more to stop criminal drug dealers ganging up on New Zealand.

Kristina and fellow emerging artists Heidi Van Duyn and Jennie McGregor have each donated a painting, which can be viewed at Te Awaroa Café. the café and the sale proceeds will go to riding school owner Sandi Rayner's dog rescue operation.

Coming from a family of painters, Kristina has always painted. Like the rest of her family she has also always been an animal lover and has taken her favourite subjects from nature – mostly flowers, animals, birds and landscapes - so it's no surprise that the first painting she sold was of two lovebirds. What is remarkable is that the venue was a Pumphouse art exhibition and that she was just 11 at the time.

The horse is a favourite subject, and when she's not painting them, Kristina is riding them.
