



Major disruption ahead

In the second week of August Council staff and tenants of the Helensville Service Centre were called to a meeting to be advised that the building was to be effectively closed from mid October until the end of January 2023.

This came as a complete shock to many of them as various bookings had been accepted for events during this period, generally the busiest period of the year.

Then, out of the blue, the RSA closed with nowhere to go; the Art Centre with no shows; the Library with no children's holiday programme; the Lions with nowhere to hold their Book Fair. Those with bookings already made and confirmed were suddenly cancelled and people were just told to make other arrangements!

The scale of the repairs and renovations is so extensive that they must have been planned for many months, if not years. The work planned covers weathertightness, removal of asbestos, seismic strengthening, roof replacement and back door canopy. Replacement of roof ridge flashing and fixings, water damaged roof framing, new roof cladding and flashing, decayed wall timber and wall cladding and window hardware.

Replacement of stairwell fire door and signage and ramp to the carpark. Removal of existing external retaining wall and some fencing and installation of a new retaining wall with path and steps with fire escape route from the library.

The list goes on and on and is so extensive that one has to wonder whether it will be completed in the suggested time frame; it seems more likely that it will take much, much longer!

Not all bad news

On their Facebook page the Helensville Library and Service Centre recently advised that they will be open throughout the remedial works on the building.

They said that they may have to close for short periods, possibly at short notice, due to dust or noise, but said they would keep the public updated via their Facebook page.



After 2 years of disrupted Ag Day events due to our pandemic, Helensville Primary School are very excited to announce that we will be back together to celebrate our:





Planned Whenuapai development

You may be aware of some green space in Whenuapai made up of approximately 360 hectares that's currently being zoned for development, for both industrial and residential use. Until recently, the Council determined they would provide a specific plan for the area, previously known as Plan Change Five. This plan was to determine where the housing would be, among other things, including the provision of roading, water and other infrastructure that would be needed to support the development.

However, the Council have recently announced they don't actually have money in their budget to support the development and have subsequently withdrawn Plan Change Five. The issue we now have is that the developments proposed for the area will likely go ahead anyway, as they have already been approved by central government. Sadly, this means we will end up with an incomplete development made up of ad-hoc plans that will make sense for a small area, without taking into account the needs of the wider community as a whole. Another consequence of this issue means that we risk the development being constructed by the cheapest means possible and therefore hold a lower value than it is deserving of. We also have a threat of danger to this area because there won't be the supporting infrastructure required, due to the nature of ad-hoc planning that will take place at a later point, resulting in a disjointed development in the area.

As your local MP, I'll do whatever I can to push back on this issue to local authorities and ensure the message I send brings to the forefront the need for better coordinated planning of our areas. As the saying goes, the whole is greater than the sum of its parts. Because when this happens, I know that we can achieve better outcomes for our communities.

Crime is increasingly brazen!

New Zealand's news headlines lately could be out of the L. A. Times, with ramraids, gang violence, youth crime and gun crime becoming a daily occurrence. The crimes are increasing brazen, such as robbing jewellery stores with a hammer in broad daylight.

People are increasingly feeling less safe in their communities and a recent TVNZ poll showed 70 per cent of New Zealanders think the Government isn't doing enough to deal with gangs. I've been talking to people in my community in West Auckland who have been intimidated by gang members and people around the country tell me it's time for real and meaningful change.

I've seen processions of gang members on bikes in my community and witnessed police chases and armed police responding to violence.

These hardened criminals were in all probability once young criminals committing lower level crime.

ACT's most recent policy document tackles law and order, an area where the Government's beltway ideology has failed and people on main street are feeling real consequences.

Labour has been getting criminals and victims mixed up. Now we're feeling the consequence of having no consequences for crime. It's time for solutions and to put victims back at the centre of our justice system and marginalising criminals.

On Tuesday the Prime Minister said in Parliament she "disputed the suggestion that overall we have a proliferation of criminal acts by young people because there has not been evidence to suggest that." Then the Police Minister revealed there had been 129 ram raids in only three months committed by young people, how's that for evidence?

An example of Labour's ideology taking precedence over safety was when they recently repealed Three Strikes laws. You can say what you like about Three Strikes, but here's what removing it means.

Until Labour removed the law, people with previous "strikes" were heading for a maximum sentence if they committed another violent or sexual offence. Now they don't have to worry about getting the max.

This sends signals to the public, including the criminal community. You can't blame wayward youth for giving crime a chance when the Government is softening the consequences of it for the worst of the worst offenders.

ACT recognises the need for practical solutions and has proposed policy aimed at tackling crime. For example:

- Gang Injunction Orders
- Turning Inland Revenue on the gangs
- A Member's Bill that would have delivered the tools to crack down on gangs and illegal firearm use (and still will under a new Government)
- Electronically monitored spending for gang members on welfare
- Restricting the use of electronic bail, while dropping the target for lower prison numbers
- Infringement notices for youth offenders, leading to instant, practical penalties instead of justice delayed
- Introducing Three Strikes for burglary, recognising it is a recidivist crime
- Financial reparations made by the Crown, so victims don't have to watch their attacker putting 65 cents a week in their account for 10 years

We've also announced policies in years past that we stand by such as increasing police in line with the population, no parole unless rehabilitation has been done, and an Independent Review of the IPCA.

It's time we sent a message to New Zealand that crime will be punished, that if you're willing to take part in rehabilitation you will be given another chance but most importantly that victims are at the heart of the justice system.

Kaipara College does RYDA

Since 2001, the RYDA (Rotary Youth Driver Awareness) programme has been educating young New Zealanders on road safety and awareness in schools. On Wednesday, August 10th, 2022, the Year 12s at Kaipara College were fortunate enough to take part in this programme. Much to the excitement of us students, this programme caused a cancellation of all classes for the day, and instead of a regular day filled with math equations and English essays, we moved around different stations, each filled with a new, fun activity relating to driver safety.

With approximately 230 deaths on our road so far this year, the need for driver education has never been more evident, especially for those of us who are new to the road. While not all students who took part in RYDA are driving, a main part of the course focuses on awareness on the road. This, in turn, creates not only better drivers, but also better cyclists, passengers and pedestrians. It's all about keeping each other safe.

The staff who are part of the RYDA programme incorporated many people from all walks of life. Each session was incredibly interesting and engaging. These sessions included things such as using simple questions to determine our driving personality, creating scenarios that focussed on limiting distractions, and identifying hazards on the road. We also had the opportunity to listen to a couple of policemen: both have been front-line officers for over 20 years. They focused on the importance of responsible driving while on a restricted licence, as this group has the highest crash rate. The most exciting session of the day took us out onto Awaroa Road where we watched a driving instructor brake suddenly while speeding – many of us were shocked at how long it takes to come to a stop. This session ended with the car hitting a dummy. Although this isn't appealing in a real-life sense, us students sure found it fun to watch.

The most impactful session of the day gave us the chance to speak to a woman named Kelly. In 2011, Kelly's life changed in a single moment after a car crash on an Auckland motorway. With the number of deaths on our roads, it is easy to forget the massive impact on a person, as well as their family and friends, when serious injury comes from a car accident. Ever since Kelly's accident, she has been taking part in many forms of rehabilitation, some of which included relearning to talk and walk. Kelly's story is just one of many, and it was nothing short of inspirational. It only took a quick glance around the room to see that Kelly's story resonated with everyone; she captivated the room. As a participant in the RYDA programme, I, along with many other students, are incredibly grateful to Kelly for dedicating her time to educating us on the importance of driver awareness.
