 $Kaipara\ Coast\ Sculpture\ Gardens\ is\ located\ within\ some\ of\ the\ most\ stunning\ countryside\ in\ Auckland\ and\ offers\ something\ for\ everyone.$ 

The Sculpture Gardens are easily accessed from most parts of Auckland via the main arterial highways as it is located only 4km north of Kaukapakapa Village on SH16, with the entrance to the gardens and carpark at Kaipara Coast Plant Centre.

\*There are approximately 40 sculptures (some interactive) located along a 1km exhibition trail, which are changed each November. Also if you are feeling like a little more energetic, the recently

created 2.5km nature trail meanders through long established as well as newly planted areas of native flora and with a real focus on regeneration and sustaining the ecological diversity and integrity of the area. There are also some amazing rural and harbour views.\*

The gardens were established in 1994 by the local Bayley family who still own and run it, and are now a 4 star NZ Gardens trust nominee.

There are games and activities along the trail suitable for all ages with seats and shady trees dotted along the way.

There is also a barbeque area as well as many ideal locations to sit and enjoy a picnic as well as our cute little coffee shop.

The Gardens are open 9am to 5pm - 7 days (with the last entry at 4pm).  $\,$



# El Niño to blow hot and cold this summer. What does it mean for Aucklanders?

It means we can expect stronger or more frequent winds from the west which will encourage dryness in eastern areas and more rain in the west with periods of unseasonable warmth followed by sharp cold southerlies.

While it's looking like it's going to be a hotter than normal summer and that's great news for holidaymakers and beachgoers, it's not so good for rural Aucklanders who don't have access to mains water supply.

Auckland Council's General Manager Healthy Waters Craig Mcilroy says if there were lessons to be learnt from the 2019-2020 drought, it's the need for rural communities to be prepared.

"As the summer rolls around, it's a timely reminder for rural residents to think about their water supplies.

"If you're reliant on rainwater tanks for your drinking water, check the tank levels regularly, use water wisely and book a delivery early.

"Forward planning is key to avoiding the experience of 2019-20, so it's important to keep your "eye on the ball" adds Mcilroy.

Facing the prospect of another dry summers Auckland Council has established 26 permanent community water sites around rural Auckland to help mitigate the situation and assist with future drought management should it arise.

The bollards will provide a back-up drinking water supply in an emergency where residents will be able to collect 20 litres of water per person per day for the filling of water bottles yearround.

Auckland Council has a network of 78 rain gauges across the region which are monitored for rainfall levels. Automatic alerts for low rainfall notify the operations team to set up the bollards for bottle filling with all the sites meeting current drinking water standards.


### Steps to take now before you run out of water:

- check your water tank levels regularly
- monitor your water usage and make lifestyle changes, such as shorter showers
- consider the needs of livestock if they are using your rain tank supply
- find out the local water supplier, in case you need a top-up over the holidays
- plan and book water refill deliveries early
- ensure tanks are well maintained and roof guttering is free of debris
- install water-saving devices in showerheads and taps
- consider investing in extra tank capacity.

El Niño is an oceanic and atmospheric phenomenon that marks the warm phase of the El Niño–Southern Oscillation (ENSO). It is associated with a band of warm ocean water that develops in the central and east-central equatorial Pacific (approximately between the International Date Line and 120°W), including the area off the west coast of South America. The ENSO is the cycle of warm and cold sea surface temperature (SST) of the tropical central and eastern Pacific Ocean. (From Wikepedia.)



Thanks also to the families of Club members who were with us all weekend and the students from Kaipara College who helped in the set up on Friday, also the Kaukapakapa/Helensville Scout troop and Friends of Lions who assisted in packing up and cleaning the Hall on Sunday. Putting together a book fair is an all-round team effort and we would not be able to cope without the assistance we receive from our community. Especially the Helensville A&P Show who gave us the unlimited use of their grounds for the lead up to the weekend, this will now be our home for the foreseeable future. Surplus children's books go to South Auckland for distribution to Playcentres and Kindergartens. I hope that everyone has a relaxing summer break in prospect. It's been a tough couple of years for many people locally, particularly with such poor weather placing a real dampener on any sense of holiday occasion 12 months ago.

With the last Christmas-New Year period having been marred by flooding and a literal cyclone, it was inevitable that the following year would feel tough for many. The struggle has been particularly hard when it's come to displaced households, businesses going underwater (in a literal and sometimes figurative sense) and all the mental burden that comes with it all.

But it's the festive season now, so a sense of optimism feels appropriate. Recently I've taken part in Santa Parades in different parts of the electorate that have been exceptionally well attended. People are ready to hear good news!

Parliament has resumed after a quiet period down there, before and after the election. As always, I'm especially interested in debates on laws that will impact the good people of northwest and north Auckland.

We've just seen the repeal of the ute tax (aka "clean car discount") that had seen rural areas disproportionately required to subsidise expensive EVs such as Teslas. To my mind, that's a positive.

We've also just seen the cancellation of a boondoggle project in the form of the Cook Strait Ferry replacement. This had seen massive blowouts (to the tune of billions) without the project even getting underway in any concrete sense, so it seems a no-brainer to end that waste. With funds freed up in the transport budget available across New Zealand by that cancellation, areas needing attention in terms of new roads and rail – and repairing and maintaining existing ones – will benefit as a result. Watch this space!

And the big news in this political week was the coalition government's confirmation that the "3 Waters" centralising project will be canned in the New Year. Spending huge amounts of taxpayer money on a bureaucracy to support water infrastructure (before a single dollar is spent on culverts, pipes etc.) simply cannot be justified. And that's before you get to the loss of local democracy inherent in that scheme.


I'm feeling optimistic about our country's future and hope you are too.

# Helensville Library and Service Centre update

Auckland Council Libraries staff in Helensville are receiving praise for stepping up to continue delivering library and council services to their local community – throughout a challenging year. Renewal works to address maintenance and seismic strengthening issues at the Helensville War Memorial and Library building, which also houses Kaipara RSA, Plunket, Art Centre Helensville, and the Helensville/Waimauku Family Budgeting Service, started in October 2022.

Unexpected issues have extended the completion timeframe, including the removal of asbestos detected in parts of the building. The library has been able to continue operating up until October this year, when remedial works to update the library fire exits began.

Since then, the team has set up a temporary library in a mobile bus, providing an alternative space for customers to browse books and other reading resources once the library building had closed. The bus's electrical system then developed a fault, so staff adapted once again to work on laptops while a replacement bus was considered.



To minimise further changes, the library team have opted instead for a small but welcoming service in the library's front foyer that will continue until repairs have been completed – estimated to be in late February 2024.

Helensville Library manager Sally Hardwick says customers can choose 'Take 5' lucky-dip bags and a click-and-collect service at the foyer throughout summer, along with printing, scanning services, and Wi-Fi.

"Our focus has been to ensure access to our collections and services remain available to everyone. We are grateful for the

"We do appreciate the support customers have shown for the tremendous work our library team is doing throughout this process," she says.

Once the works are finished, the library will have a new wheelchair accessible ramp to the car park and fully compliant fire exits in place, as well as a new office area.

Meanwhile, customers can continue to return books to the Helensville Library or to any other Tamaki Makaurau library site.

## Coalition Change is under way

In your community, the north-west of Auckland is poised to benefit significantly from a greater investment in roads and public transport, thanks to the accelerated efforts of the Coalition Government. As the Under-Secretary for Resource Management Reform and Infrastructure, I am proud to announce the initiation of a work program aimed at making the process of obtaining consents and building approvals more straightforward.
