

## **ANZAC Day 2019**

The national terror threat level was lifted to high following the Christchurch terrorist attacks on March 15 and lowered to medium a month later. The first many of us heard about how this was to affect our local Anzac Day commemorations was via a Facebook post then a New Zealand Herald report informing that the Kaipara Memorial RSA Anzac Day services, along with most other West Auckland-based Returned Services Associations locations, were to be cancelled due to fears over potential counter-actions to the attacks. Many were outraged, but it turned out the decision, following discussions between the police and the

Returned Services Association, was selected services were to be held indoors. not cancelled entirely. This was primarily because police felt they didn't have the numbers to cover outside venues and were worried someone might drive a vehicle into the

crowd. Our RSA was visited by police, who did a risk assessment of the Parakai site and the Helensville Parade area and advised the RSA they couldn't make the areas safe.

Kaipara Memorial RSA therefore cancelled its traditional outdoor events and held a well-attended service in the Helensville community hall, while locals went ahead and independently organised and ran a dawn service at Parakai Cenotaph and a wreathlaying event at Helensville Cemetery, both of which were also well-attended. As always, the RSA club rooms were open all day for people to gather and share food, stories and companionship.

The Kaukapakapa Anzac Day service

went ahead outside the community hall, with over 500 people turning up, far more than usual. The event is run by the community – specifically Athol McLachlan, John Tucker and Megan Paterson – and is therefore independent of the RSA. The organising committee invited Rex Keane from Kaipara Memorial RSA to MC.

Despite their independence from the RSA, the community group had to go through considerable red tape to get the show on the road. After Auckland Council arbitrarily informed Megan by email the service was cancelled, MP Chris Penk and Board member Phelan Pirrie intervened. "They were both amazing going into bat for us and we would not have pushed it through without their support," says Megan. There was also intense pressure from the police to cancel, but after their risk assessment and lengthy discussions they agreed the ceremony could go ahead if, to mitigate the risk, the entrance to the carpark was blocked off by the local brigade's two fire engines once the service began. While there is usually no police presence at the service, this year four armed police were there. Also there from Trentham was a representative of NZDF, Wing Commander Michelle White.

Asked why she fought so hard for the event to go ahead Megan, who has spent many hours posting information on the online cenotaph about the Kaukapakapa men and women who have done war service, says, "It did get pretty scary, especially when the



## Physio Talks

## Posture is an important habit

Did your mother (grandmother, auntie, dad) nag you to "Stand up straight!" when you were just a whipper snapper? Guess what, they were right.

While body symmetry left and right is a new age myth, front to back balanced alignment is not, and this is the alignment the nagging was all about. Look at people from the side and you will see an assortment of postures, some of which are likely to cause problems. Look at the posture, any posture, from the side and check these points of reference for best posture: ear over shoulder (cheekbone vertical over breast bone); shoulder over hip; hip over ankle. Try watching for it the next time you're at the beach. it's much easier there. The further out of alignment these points get, the more likely the person will have discomfort as a result. That's payback for not "standing up straight".

The most commonly seen misalignment is ear in front of shoulder, which goes with slumped shoulders (in front of hips), the classic "not standing up straight". But, since a person's head, neck, upper back and shoulders are all closely related, this posture can result in anything from headache, to backache, to one or both sore shoulders. Likewise, a sore shoulder can result in slumped shoulders and forward head. You can start with any original problem and get any combination of the above. For example, a person with an injured shoulder will have a much more difficult time with recovery if the injury is on top of bad posture.

Improper posture has been acquired over time, by endless repetition. The posture is now a habit, and feels normal to the wearer. It may have originated from an injury, but more likely just from inattention. Mom wasn't around any more to provide reminders. So, if posture is an acquired habit, can it be changed for the better? How do you change it?

Yes, you can change it, by repeating a substitute (hopefully improved) posture repeatedly over time. Does it work? Yes. It is one of the few guaranteed physio outcomes available. But it is only guaranteed if you do the repetitions of the new posture. One way to NOT change a posture is to straight away assume the new and improved posture, holding it steady hour after hour. That way goes pain and disorder, mainly because you are asking your body to make multiple sudden changes of muscles, joints and ligaments, without allowing for the adjustments necessary. So, if a patient comes into the clinic with a sore shoulder and forward head with rounded upper back, I'll recommend treatment to help the shoulder recover, but will also strongly recommend the patient begin changing the posture habit little by little, every day a little more. That way, in three weeks, the shoulder will likely be feeling better, helped along by the improved posture, and the new posture will nearly be permanent. Three weeks is what it takes to correct a postural alignment, assuming the patient has the self discipline to repeat the new posture pattern. And the proof that the new posture is permanent is that the old posture now feels odd, rather than normal, and the new one feels right. Even if the shoulder injury is not completely repaired within the three weeks it took for the postural change, it will now much more likely be successfully rehabilitated than it could have been with bad posture.

These comments are general in nature. Be sure to check with your physio or doctor if you are not sure whether they apply to your situation.



## **Gumboot Friday**

Helensville showed very good support for Mike King's Gumboot Friday on April 5, the purpose of which was to raise funds via gold coin donations for kiwi kids to get free mental health counselling and support when they urgently need it. The campaign has the support of many prominent New Zealanders, including Taika Waititi, Steve Hanson and Jacinda Ardern.

Mike King's idea came from the thought that "Having depression is like walking through mud every day. On Gumboot Friday we put on our gumboots and walk through mud with people to show that we care and we're out there listening. The key to the initiative is fun, because that's what kids like more than anything else."

Marie Adlam, who coordinates the Bridge to Hope suicide prevention awareness team of volunteers established in Helensville in 2015, supported the initiative by delivering flyers to schools, preschool centres and businesses in Helensville and Parakai with her three-year-old daughter, and by talking to people. "We did our best to get the message through," she says. "We have one of the highest youth suicide rates in the world. Gumboot Friday statistics say in 2018 we lost 137 youth to suicide and 3500 attempted to take their own lives." Marie thanks her daughter for keeping her company and everyone who responded so positively to Gumboot Friday. Overall the initiative raised over a million dollars.

Those feeling they need support can attend Bridge to Hope suicide prevention sessions 3pm to 5pm on Wednesdays at 118 Commercial Road, Helensville.

## **Homestead Early Learning Centre**

Since taking over the boutique Homestead Early Learning Centre in the beautiful 120-year-old villa by the Helensville/Parakai roundabout last July, owner Amanda Pipe and her team have been making changes. The baby space is now suitable for the age group, teachers are working more closely together with better teacher/child ratios, there's a big designated sleep room and the outdoor

area has been turfed and made more appropriate for infants and toddlers. Amanda has also purchased new, more challenging playground equipment for the preschool playground.

"What we're working towards is bringing more choice into what the children are doing, depending on what stage they're at," she says. "But we're also maintaining a structure that makes them feel comfortable. We try and make it a really positive environment, a home away from home, with learning and care side by side."

It's all about aiming for balance, where structured learning and learning through play keep the children engaged and interested. Opportunities are provided for them to develop their physical, social and intellectual skills, develop confidence and learn about taking appropriate risks on the playground equipment. "We are very focussed on providing learning opportunities appropriate for the current understanding of brain development," says Amanda. "We encourage life skills children will need in the future, such as empathy, personal connectivity, resilience and creativity. We're lucky to have such a wonderful natural environment of over 3000 square metres, with plenty of grass and gardens. The children are given opportunities for creativity in art, music and construction and we encourage their fascination with the natural world."

The children are separated into areas according to age: under two, with three teachers and a maximum of 12 children; two to three-year olds, with two teachers and 12-15children; pre-schoolers three and a half to five, whose days are a little more structured as they are introduced to the idea of school. Currently there are some vacancies in the two-to-four years old space as recently several children left to go to school.

Amanda, whose mother was an early childhood teacher ("so it's always been part of my life") began her career as an accountant but switched to early childhood after she had her two children. Inspired by a nurturing early childhood education centre she found for her children in central Auckland, where the staff had incredible connection with and empathy for the children, she resolved to become part of it once her children were less dependent. "The staff there understood children's different

developmental stages and their needs at different ages. I saw how their passion and the pure love of what they were doing were the keys to their success."

While, as the owner, Amanda oversees all the centre's business, Lisa Winiata is "the wonderful centre manager", working closely with Homestead's six experienced permanent staff and three relievers. "Homestead works so well because all the staff have a common vision and are passionate about what they do. The children are getting a really high quality of education and care while also having a lot of fun," Amanda says. "All the teams are working well together, and the children are settled and content. I'm incredibly proud of what we've achieved and that we are developing a fantastic reputation in Helensville for being a quality childhood education centre."
