

Kaipara College looks ahead by Helen Martin

Recent television and newspaper articles discussing the new high school enrolment scheme beginning on 1 January 2020 reveal that compulsory zoning will shut some out of the opportunity to attend Kaipara College. This will not affect our local Community of Learning Kâhui Ako primary schools -Waitoki, Kaukapakapa, Waioneke, Woodhill, Helensville, Parakai and Waimauku - which remain in the catchment area. But students living in Riverhead, Kumeu and Huapai, who up until now have made up 20% of Kaipara College's Year 9 intake, will have to go elsewhere.

While this is very disappointing for both the families concerned and for Kaipara College, given that the school has had a longstanding relationship with those areas and that the new enrolment scheme restricts the choices available to those not in the zone, in terms of Kaipara College's growing roll it offers more breathing space. As Principal

Steve McCracken explains, "We had over 250 appeals against the proposed enrolment scheme and it's disappointing we weren't heard, but on the other hand it is a way of the Ministry of Education making sure we control our own growth. At present, with 800 students we're at capacity, and our numbers are set to increase rapidly even without the students who will now be forced to go elsewhere."

The Ministry plan to eventually take the roll to 1350, although at this stage the Board of Trustees thinks the ideal roll for Kaipara College would be 1000 students. Meanwhile, plans are moving ahead for a \$22 million build to include a new technology block with 14 classrooms, two extra science labs and a whare ako which includes a café available to the community. "We're going to have a multimillion-dollar facility," says Principal McCracken. "We're very lucky to have such a beautiful site and what we must do is use it to serve the local community."

Wahi Taitamariki (Youth space) offered by The SKYouth Trust.

SKYouth Trust of Te Awaroa Helensville has been operating out of the South Kaipara Men's Centre on Awaroa Road and offering a free drop-in space for college-aged youths, every Friday 3.30pm – 6pm during the school term. They are now expanding their opening hours to include Thursdays, inviting year 8 students to come on this day and grow connections before transitioning into college.

So far, the space has proved popular, with local youth enjoying a range of activities like cooking, basketball and boxing alongside just 'hanging out' with music and friends in a safe environment. "Planning and implementing their own ideas as well as opportunities to develop leadership skills are encouraged" says SKYouth Trust representative and Community Youth Worker Jeanette Cummings, who sees her involvement as complementary to the student support work she does for the Helensville Women & Family Centre at Kaipara College.

While the young people are supervised by youth workers, the Trust is interested in community volunteers who may like to share a skill or cultural experience by registering their interest as a mentor for Wahi Taitamariki. In particular, youth have asked for carving, building and ways to express themselves through art. SKYouth Trust would also like to grow cultural experiences in this space and welcome ideas from our Maori and Pasifika communities. SKYouth express a strong emphasis on creating a safe space, supportive of diversity and with an understanding of youth depression. Information and pathways to connect young people and their whanau to other support in these areas will be available. "Whanau movie nights and a disco are in the planning stages and sub-committees inclusive of youth and community would be a great combination to bring these to fruition", says Jeanette. The SKYouth Trust are hopeful that by 2021 this youth space will be open three days a week with a collective of local volunteers and the opportunity for activities to spill over into the school holiday period. They would also like to thank the South

Arts in the Ville: something for everyone

With more than 60 artists in over 25 venues, Labour Weekend's Arts in the Ville promises to be action packed. The Hat Walk, which was hugely popular last year, will be held in the War Memorial all at 4.30pm on Sunday 27 October and, on behalf of the Arts Centre, Jeff Thomson's visual treasure hunt will be again be on all weekend, this time with a musical theme.

Among the artists showing in their home studios will be Joanne Sullivan, whose work is widely known through her bronze sculptures Phar Lap and Sir John Walker. As well as making a range of bronze works, Joanne also creates beautiful glass pieces. On the Sunday of Arts in the Ville she will open her new studio, giving visitors the opportunity to learn about her practice as a sculptor and to see progress on her latest work, a seven-foot bronze sculpture of Papatuanuku, commissioned by Kotuku Wellness Retreat, Mangawhai.

While some artists will be in their studios, others, like Jacky Pieper, will demonstrate their work in the War Memorial Hall. Jacky, who has a background as an engineer and graphic artist, and who for some time had a shop in Helensville where she sold jewellery and clothing of her own make and design, studied sculpting in France last year under Martine Vaugel and is now making busts and figurines. She is currently working towards an exhibition and is happy to take commissions.

From Penk's Pen

I've previously commented here how much I enjoy representing this community locally but my role also includes considering such controversial issues as euthanasia, abortion and recreational drugs. It's unprecedented that a single Parliamentary term features so many tough issues. It's certainly a baptism of fire for me personally.

These matters are almost invariably "conscience votes" in Parliament, meaning that each MP makes his or her own decision free from a party position. My responsibility is to represent the whole electorate – blue or red, rich or poor, conservative or liberal, weak or strong – and I take that very seriously.

First, I acknowledge openly that, like everyone, I have a philosophical starting-point for considering these matters. In the case of recreational drugs, it's the danger of addiction for young minds. In the case of euthanasia, it's a fear of coercion for our neglected elderly. In the case of abortion, it's balancing the right of a woman to protect her own health and that of her unborn being (a "foetus" or a "baby", as you wish) developing continuously towards birth.

I've been upfront about these issues whenever asked, from the 2017 election campaign onwards, but I also welcome constituents' views, as these can challenge or confirm. I can't ultimately satisfy everyone's wishes – as any given vote will please some and displease others – but I can and do take all viewpoints seriously.

As with any human endeavour, consultation is not a perfect process and I'm particularly wary of binary questions about complex issues. For example, polling ostensibly on the End of Life Choice Bill cannot be considered reliable when catch-all euphemisms such as "assisted dying" are used, given this can variously mean palliative care, standard pain relief or (as the Bill seeks to introduce) euthanasia and assisted suicide practices.

I remain happy to meet with any constituent to discuss any issue so please keep the contact coming!

Matariki Community Health Workshops

Three workshops aimed at breaking down barriers between Mâori and Western health systems, initiated by Dr Tomos Longworth from Kaipara Medical Centre, were a huge success, thanks to the collaborative efforts of many people and community organisations.



The events were designed to encourage the community to access primary health care services in a timely manner, to introduce whanau and the wider community to mainstream health providers in the area sympathetic to the continued use of traditional Maori healing practices and to reconnect whanau to those practices. Held on three Tuesday evenings in July and August in the Helensville War Memorial Hall, the well-attended workshops included enlightening panel discussions with local registered health experts, question and answer sessions and Rongoa Mâori (Mâori medicine) presentations.

The workshops were held in a spirit of positivity and fun. Sessions began with the gift of a goody bag to each person attending and a stirring welcome from Kaipara College Kapa Haka Ngâ Taniwha o Kaipara. There was great interest taken in the kaupapa and attendees were impressed by the quality of the presentations. Added to that was some excellent kai, comprehensive Library displays, an all-in linedance led by Levia Aukimo-uruamo's local group and even some pelvic floor exercises, performed with much hilarity, the concept of which was a revelation to many present.

Valuable input was provided by Mâori Health Services, Te Ha Oranga, Helensville Pharmacy, Ngâ Taniwha o Kaipara, Te Runanga o Ngâti Whatua, Ora New Zealand, Physio Flex and Kaipara College. Respected Rongoa Mâori practitioner Donna Kerridge and Dr Longworth provided strong guidance throughout, focusing on the idea that the old can work alongside the new in ways that are complementary and productive, while Helensville Library, led by Sally and Anne, did a brilliant job co-ordinating the whole event and undertaking many of the hands-on jobs.

Koha collected over the three weeks resulted in a donation of \$1,050 to Kaipara College Kapa Haka Ngâ Taniwha o Kaipara.

June Beryl Pamela O'Keeffe was born on 5th April 1932 in the Puriri St Helensville family home where her mother was also born. She was the eldest child of James O'Keeffe from Kaeo and Riwia Rita Paenganui Aperahama from Helensville.

June grew up in Helensville with her siblings and cousins on her mother's side, spending time with her aunties and cousins in Helensville, Reweti, Henderson and Auckland City. After her father passed away when June was only five, she would occasionally visit her paternal family in Kaeo. In later years she rekindled her



friendship with her Kaeo cousin Rahera Rogers, who became her constant companion in her later years. June's bond with her cousins remained throughout her life.

JunemarriedEdward (Ned) Cowper on 25th October 1952. She had an instant family as stepmother to Don and Keith, whosemother had previously passed away. June and Ned went on to have four children together, Michael, Linda, Maryanne who died when she was two, and Donna.

Once Donna turned five and started school, June was offered a job at the Helensville Exchange. She worked there for 23 years until the manual exchange went onto the automatic circuit, ending an era of personal service in Helensville. The staff at the exchange became her second family, and it was from there that June became best friends with her Supervisor, Dot Collins. In retirement June and Dot were often seen together around Helensville, more often

June supported Ned in the many organisations he belonged to and she spoke fondly of the Helensville Volunteer Fire Brigade and their social gatherings. She was always willing to help at any functions for the Helensville Bowling Club.

June kept herself fit as she aged. She walked everywhere, partly because she didn't have a driver's licence. She loved to walk and joined the Helensville walking club. She was a member of the Women's Section of the RSA and enjoyed the bus trips they did together. She was a Member of CMA Helensville and the Country Women's Association. She also supported Te Ha Oranga and loved attending the Kuia and Kaumatua hui. She volunteered at Hospice when it first opened in Helensville, working there for several years.

June could put her hand to anything – sewing clothes for her family and making preserves, jams and chutneys. She always had home baking in the tins, as did most women of that era.

June adored her many mokopuna. When she could no longer get out and about, they made the time to visit their Nana, coming from overseas, up north and down south. As her health deteriorated and June spent more time in bed, her Helensville grandchildren and their partners played a major part in keeping her entertained. The Helensville Area Committee of St John are partnering with local service organisations to install publicly available Automated External Defibrillators (AED's) in easily accessible locations, around our area. This is the first stage of a roll out of more units from Kumeu to Glorit and South Head.



Area Committee Treasurer John Issott thanks RSA President Les Coste for allowing St John to install the first AED outside the RSA.

A check on the **AED** Locations App' (which

EVERYONE should have on their phone!), will show a reasonable number of such machines in our area. However most of them are held inside and are therefore only available, whilst the premises are open. The Area Committee recognised this, so are working to have more located on outside walls.

St John have installed the first one, alongside the main doors of the Helensville RSA, in the middle of Commercial Road.

The RSA supports the local community with lots of use of their facilities by their members and the public:for events, fund raising for local schools, kindergartens and the Local Volunteer Fire and Emergency crews. Everyone is welcome and with *Millies* restaurant, within the premises, it's a great place to have a meal and a drink.

The RSA have 1st aiders on their committee but the AED is independent and available 24/7. There are full instructions on the outside of the cover but the most important thing is to ring 111. The St John communications staff will help you unlock the alarmed cover. The AED itself speaks all necessary actions, so it is simple to operate.

The RSA have thanked St John for their initiative and hope that one day it helps to save the life of a friend or family member.

The Lions Club of Helensville have also purchased an AED from St John, for installation at the tennis Club at Rautawhiri Park. South Kaipara Rotary are also looking to assist with this roll out.

Helensville St John Area Committee would like to talk to any organisations or businesses, in the area, that would be willing to have an AED attached to the outside wall of their premises, so it is available all the time. Now there are a couple in Helensville centre, they are looking further afield. Ideally it should be located on a South facing wall and have a canopy or similar cover. The units and their own covers are very robust but direct sunlight will eventually require their replacement. The chest pads and special battery packs are replaced periodically. Our St John Youth divisions are always keen to demonstrate how to do CPR and talk about using an AED. Again ask via the Op-Shop.

Christmas Parade lacks funding to survive

Helensville's Christmas Parade has long struggled to source adequate funding.

Auckland Council, whilst very positive towards the event, has significantly reduced funding to \$2,000 annually over recent years.

North West Country (Business Association) provides \$2,500.

With the event budget at over \$8,000, there is obviously a significant shortfall. Helensville Lions met much of that for a few years, but last year advised at short notice that they were unable to continue to do so. The Anglican Methodist Church helped with \$1,000, but I personally picked up the balance.

This is not appropriate on going. It has been suggested that individuals/businesses may choose to fund specific budget items, as detailed below:
