

Our proud Helensville office opened in June 1991 and has been supporting the community ever since. So what sort of things do people ask about and how am I supposed to know stuff?

Every volunteer is trained and shown how to access information by tapping into our massive information base. Volunteers are valued and appreciated and every effort is made to make sure they are comfortable in their roles and stay up-to-date. You will be rostered once a week for a two-and a-half hour shift, with another volunteer. The office manager is there to help.

Clients make contact with the CAB for help on an amazing variety of subjects, ranging from things like tenancy issues, employment disputes, barking dogs, irritating neighbours, how to get to a hospital appointment, bus timetables, how to find a local tradesman, endless variety. But nothing ever beats us.

So, if you are a warm, empathetic person who basically likes your fellow man (and woman) and just likes giving something back in your community, pick up the phone (09-420-7162 for the Manager) or just walk in and have a chat with us. Go on, it might just be fun.



Armistice Day in Helensville

Armistice Day was especially poignant in Helensville this year as, with the Anzac Day parade cancelled because of Covid, it was the first opportunity in 2020 for Kaipara Memorial RSA to hold a public commemoration event to honour those who served their country.

While there's some controversy over the precise time shelling actually ceased at the end of World War 1, Armistice Day is commemorated every year at 11am on 11 November, the 11th month. The ceremony marks the signing of an armistice between the Allies of World War 1 and Germany at Compiègne, France for the cessation of hostilities on the Western Front. This year's anniversary was the 102nd.

RSA resident Les Coste spoke of the sacrifices made and, as she does at Anzac Day services, Reverend Verna Healy reminded attendees of the importance of protecting the peace, stability, freedom and safeguarding the interests of our country to all service personnel. She and Retts Van Dam sang a beautiful version of the national anthem, Cedric McLeod played the pipes and wreaths were laid before The Last Post was played.

It was a small gathering, and those going about their business in Commercial Road while the ceremony progressed may have wondered what it was about – perhaps next year they'll join in and find out.

Ending with exams

At the Year 13 prize giving a few weeks ago, the stage at the front of the Kaipara College hall was full of shining trophies. Two beautiful bouquets of flowers adorned the stage. Year 13s grinned as they received their awards at the last prize giving they had to attend at Kaipara College.

The next time I went into the hall it was very different. Rows of desks were lined up in the stark white hall. Exam papers lay on the desks, ready for the students. Signs were splattered here and there on the walls saying, 'No watches allowed.'

There is a routine to exams. Students file in silently to the hall as their names are called, throwing bags down at the back before finding their seats. Some students are jittery, some icily calm. Other students glance around nervously, looking for something. An escape, perhaps? At the supervisor's word, students rip open the plastic exam packs and wait to begin the exam. For the next three hours, they are to stay in the exam room, but actually, most students leave before their time is up.

There is always that one person whose phone rings in the exam hall, despite stern warnings to turn all phones off beforehand. The school bell is startlingly loud when you are engrossed in a math problem, and the scraping of a chair as someone leaves can be equally distracting.

For some exams, the hall is full of rows and rows of students (and the occasional empty desk for no shows). In other exams, there is only a smattering of people at the front.

Afterwards, students wait outside, comparing answers. "How did you find the exam?"

"Not good." "I think I did well on the first paper!" "The one about the zips was hard!" "I got 22m. What did you get?" "Whoops."

There is even a bit of exam envy. Some people have no exams or had their last one when others still had three or four left. Some unfortunate students have four exams in one week. I was fortunate to have my exams a few days apart.



I had my maths exam on a teacher only day, so the only students in the school were those doing exams. I was surprised to find I was the only student on my morning bus. A bit different from the usual overcrowding!

After the last exam ends students head off to summer jobs, holidays by the beach or just home to mooch around until school starts again. In mid January, our results will arrive and we once again will be thrown back into the reality of school and grades.

A welcome addition to our art

The historic butcher shop on the corner of Karaka St and Commercial Rd has again sprung into life. Under the name Gallery X, the pop-up space is home to artwork produced by the Revells, painter Genna and photographer Kerrin, who run their video company Purple Sheep Productions from their 10-acre block in Rimmer Road.

Genna and Kerrin are an enterprising couple. After gaining the tertiary qualifications that set them up for the media industry, they met at TV3 where Genna was working in motion graphics and Kerrin was a cinetape technician. They came to national attention in 2007 with their 365-day

horse trek around New Zealand, a journey that raised over \$33,00 for CanTeen and provided material for their co-produced book and documentary, both titled 'Down, Across &Up'. Shortly after daughter Elektra was born, redundancy provided the impetus to establish their company specialising in advertisements for social media and television.

The idea to display and sell their art was born from the Covid hit. Kerrin had his first experience showing his photography at Arts in the Ville 2020 and says it was enjoyable and interesting talking to locals and out-of-towners about his work. Choosing the venue for their pop-up was a no-brainer. "We love this building, so it was the perfect space for it," says Kerrin. "We want people to come in and see and enjoy our art."

While they have different preoccupations and styles, both Genna and Kerrin describe their video and artwork as 'quirky' and, while they take their art seriously, both enjoy the positive emotional effects of bright, bold colours.

Genna paints in the style of pop art (she likes doing famous people and is currently working on a giant Elvis) and also produces pet and family portraits on commission. Her eye-catching works are in acrylic, water colour and pen and ink and she sells either the originals or canvas prints. During the times she is at Gallery X she will be painting on site.

Kerrin photographs light through metal, glass or plastic objects and has his striking images printed on canvas. He uses a digital camera and a variety of lenses, pointing out that while he brings out colour in the production process, he doesn't manipulate the images, they are not computer generated.

Gallery X has a selection of prints, with different prices and with the originals also available. Genna and Kerrin are hoping their art will sell well in this pre-Christmas season and are happy to take commissions.

Meanwhile, more adventure is in the works. Once Elektra is older the family plan to trek across the desert on camels in the Australian outback. "I'd never ridden a horse before I went around New Zealand on one," says Kerrin. "We like challenging ourselves, and none of us have ever ridden a camel."


