### Athletics successes

After a tough year with no sport, Helensville Primary School had a great month of athletics in November, starting with their school athletics event, followed by the Kaipara Athletics competition. Next was the North West Zone Athletics competition at Henderson's Trust Arena for Year 7 and 8 students. The HPS team won 18 events, had many placings in the top three and was awarded first place overall, winning the NW Zone Athletics cup with 77 decisive points.

From there, the 11 students chosen to represent the North West zone in the Auckland Athletics Championships at Mount Smart Stadium were part of the school's biggest team ever. All the students performed well, with several placed in the top eight. Of special mention are:

Georgie Collinge-Coker, Year 7, 2nd in the 400m, 5th in the 800m and 8th in the high jump.

Brooke Scrivener, Year 7, 4th in the long jump.

Mila Laarakkers, Year 7, 7th in the 800m and 8th in the 1500m.

Cassandra Zickert, Year 8, 3rd in the high jump.

Ottis Oliver-Chambers was, Year 8, 5th in the 1500m.

Sports Coordinator Nicole Stokes says the school was thrilled with the results, is proud of the students who took part and grateful to the wonderful parents who transported, supported and managed the students.

### **Touch**

Another notable sporting success was the Year 7 and 8 girls touch team, which won the North West touch competition, then competed at the Auckland Touch Championships and placed 4th overall. This was a massive achievement against some really big immediate schools.

Clients make contact with the CAB for help on an amazing variety of subjects, ranging from things like tenancy issues, employment disputes, barking dogs, irritating neighbours, how to get to a hospital appointment, bus timetables, how to find a local tradesman, endless variety. But nothing ever beats us.



Patryce sent an email to the paper via the Community News website which opened with "My name is Patryce Salmon, and I am an11-year-old journalist." With such an intriguing opening there was no choice but to follow up and arrange to meet Patryce.

It is clear that Patryce is a bold and confident young lady, "I wasn't really expecting a reply, but when I got one, I thought I had better tell my Mum," she said. On meeting Patryce and her mother it became obvious that a young person with such focused ambition, such a clear plan for their future and such a strong work ethic deserves any assistance the paper can provide.

Raised in Parakai and attending Helensville Primary School, Patryce is a familiar face to many people in the area. A natural performer, Patryce is involved in the Pasifika group at her school. She also enjoys drawing, science and crafts, but writing is her great ambition.

It was at Helensville Primary School that she first discovered her passion for writing. "My teachers don't always like my subject matter, but they always tell me my stories, articles and essays are well written." After persuading her teacher she was able to write, she was allowed to write and publish her very own class newspaper, which she called 'The Lavender Street Chronicle'. She has since been asked to contribute to the Helensville School Newsletter next year. Now, because of that email, she has been given the opportunity to write for the Helensville Community News.

In 2018, Patryce came across the story of Hilde Lysiak, an American journalist as young and ambitious as herself. Hilde, born November 2006, is an American journalist who has published the Orange Street News, a local newspaper in Selinsgrove, Pennsylvania since 2014 and in Patagonia, Arizona since 2019. She is the youngest member of the Society of Professional Journalists.

Patryce has big dreams of writing for and illustrating her own news website one day.

# Mark Dennis by Helen Martin

Mark Dennis moved to Parakai with his family when he was in his teens. He has worked in a number of roles at Parakai Springs since he was a university student and has been Operations Manager there for the past five years. He and his partner Rachel have three young children. For most people this would be enough commitment, but Mark is one of those people whose boundless energy and sense of community obligation leads him to keep taking on other roles.

He says his boss, Dion Tilson, has been a good role model. "Dion's always involved in everything. He got me onto the community patrol early on and I was secretary of that for a while." Obviously, community involvement suited Mark because, as a result of playing tennis with Dion and co-worker Annette, he became a committee member of the local tennis club. In 2018 he won the prestigious New Zealand Gardener of the Year accolade, awarded to our "horticultural superheroes" by New Zealand's oldest gardening magazine and decided by popular vote. "I always have a garden and thought I could plant extra to give away, then I decided to chuck a stand up outside and the idea caught on. I didn't really intend it to be a big thing," he says. But a big thing it became, with the idea catching on not just locally but throughout New Zealand and then, thanks to the internet, in countries overseas. In the 2019 Kiwibank New Zealander of the Year Awards Mark won a local hero medal for creating the community and vege



stand movement. He is still the administrator of the Community and Vege Stands Facebook page he established "for the community to share their spare produce from their gardens. Giving value to fruit and veg that might otherwise go to waste...". The page now has 12.8K members.

Because Mark knows Facebook pages can play a big role in fostering community spirit, he also carries out the time-consuming work of administering several others - Helensville and Parakai Community, Parakai Springs, North West Country, and Palmerston North Community.

Significantly, his latest voluntary role is as the new chairperson of the North West Country Association, Business Improvement District (BID), which serves Kaukapakapa, Helensville, South Head, Huapai, Waimauku, Kumeu and Riverhead. He says the organisation understands the amazing potential North West Auckland has to offer as Auckland's playground, and has a strong

focus on attracting visitors to the region. Also front of mind is the understanding that the backbone of a business association is ensuring local businesses are heard and supported, whether this is through advocacy, training or brand recognition. He says there is much to look forward to, including the Helensville Commercial Road development, which will see tangible progress in the area.

Addressing the fact that some businesses may still be critical of BID, Mark says the association has a responsibility to listen to any concerns, do its best to represent and support the whole area and continue to make the region's brand recognisable. He'd like anyone with comments, ideas or changes they would like to see implemented to get in touch. With Christmas around the corner and the usual local parades cancelled because of COVID-19, BID has put up Christmas trees in Kumeu and Helensville and funded Christmas lights for businesses to decorate their shop fronts. "It's about generating some Christmas spirit and encouraging people to spend locally."

Mark likes to get involved because he likes to see progress. In another big venture he's working towards becoming a Justice of the Peace, something which is music to the ears of those hoping more younger people will join up. "You hear something's going on and you ask if people need a hand," he says. "I can help out with stuff."



# **Emergency**

Happy New Year! I hope that 2021 has begun really well for you all.

No doubt over the Christmas-New Year period you will have been reflecting on a crazy past 12 months, as I certainly have been. Hopefully we're in for a bit less rough a ride!

Among all the significant political and real world events of last year was a declaration of a "climate change emergency" by the government. No one disputes the importance of our natural environment so it was fair enough as far as it went. There was a healthy degree of scepticism, however, about the value of merely stating the existence of a problem where such statements are not accompanied by much meaningful action to solve the problem.

While it's right to be cynical about the value of emergency declarations made merely for the sake of appearance, therefore, I am thinking about issuing a declaration of "traffic emergency" for our area.

Simply put, the situation on our roads has become intolerable. There are major implications for quality of life, where parents spend hours travelling that they could be spending raising their kids and so on. There is a huge effect on our productivity too, given how much time we spend driving that we could better spend making or doing things. And, of course, the most important implication is the danger to life and limb that we encounter daily, just getting from A to B.

For all these reasons, I intend to announce early in 2021 that a state of emergency exists in Auckland's west, northwest and rural north where traffic is concerned. I will be proposing a number of specific measures to address this issue – bearing in mind my own injunction against vague virtue-signalling – and hoping that the central and local government decision makers get on board.

The powers that be need to know what's needed (although they've been told many times before, it should be noted) and I'll keep doing my job of letting them know all about it. Please join me in demanding better out here. After all, it's an emergency.

This doesn't quite make up for the missed Book Fair in May, but is still a very satisfying result.

We would like to thank all of you who donated books, for without you, there would be no Book Fair. The Club would also like to thank the Friends of Lions and the wider Helensville community. Putting together a book fair is a team effort and we would not be able to cope without the assistance we receive from our community, especially the partners, friends and relatives of Club members who were present throughout the weekend. Members from Kaukapakapa/Helensville Scouts also assisted in the setting out and cleaning up of the Hall. We also wish to thank members of the Rodney Local Board for their support and Burmester Realty for letting us use their premises as a drop off point.
