We would go on patrol and after a long day in the heat returning to Naval HQ, do the debrief at Kiwi House with a few light refreshments, then out for dinner.

I got such a surprise when I was looking at Bookface and to see your article in the Helensville Community news.

Well done! Brian for doing this for Gerry you have rekindled a friendship which was made 27 years ago.

This is a collaboration between PATHS - Parents And Teachers at Helensville School and Kaipara

College PTSA - Parents, Teachers and Students Association, is bringing the Aotearoa's expert neuroscience educator Nathan Wallis to Helensville. women who participated and enrolled this time. Hopefully they were all happy with their prizes, especially the cash.





With changes to COVID alert levels always a possibility, I thought it would be a good time to remind everyone of how the library operates under each level.

Levels 3 and 4: The library is closed.

Depending upon the situation, our external returns slot may also be closed. Last year, the slot was closed until Level 2. During our short lockdown in February, it remained open.

Level 2: The library is open but physical distancing requirements mean some changes:

- Only some of the computers are available
- Some furniture will be removed
- No programmes: so, no Kids Time or visits to Craigweil/ECEs / schools
- No jigsaw puzzles for children are available
- No colouring-in pens / crayons are available colouring-in sheets may be taken home
- Staff cannot spend an extended period of time with customers

Kaukapakapa Village

Come rain or shine the Kaukapakapa Village Market is held on the 3rd Sunday of every month, from 8.30am to 1pm. It is hard to visit the market without finding something of interest, and making a few purchases. EFTPOS is available but cash is readily accepted.



Sarah Legg has been running the Kaukapakapa Village Market for the last 11 years. In 2009 she and a friend took over the running of the market, which is held at the Kaukapakapa Memorial Hall and surrounding carpark. "The market was very small when we took over, and we gradually built it up to what it is today." says Sarah.

For those curious about the effect COVID 19 may have had on the Market, as we have just come out of another lockdown, Sarah says she does not think there has been any effect on attendance. There are consistently between 40 & 80 stands each month, depending on the time of year and the weather, and always a lot of buyers.



The market always has a wide variety of stalls, from toys, plants, fresh fruit and vegetables to skincare and outdoor furniture; there is something for everyone. Even though the weather was extremely warm at 26 degrees, there was a great

turn-out of keen bargain hunters. There was live music in the hall, provided by duo Barry and Maryanne. Cakes and other treats





On January 27th, while the rest of Kaipara College was still on holiday, almost 50 year thirteen students piled onto a bus and headed up to Higham's Farm in South Head. When we got there, we set up our tents; some haphazardly and some with the expertise that comes with a summer of practice.

This was for our Peer Support Camp. Every year, year thirteen student volunteers become peer support leaders. They mentor a class of year nines through their first few months of college. This helps the year nines to break the awkwardness of meeting new people and gives them role models.

We tented on a little beach beside the Kaipara Harbour for one night and two days, doing activities in the shed and in the shade of the big trees surrounding the campground. A few phones came out to photograph the view across the harbour. The campground was off the grid- to some people's dismay. I heard a few worried voices saying, "Where do I charge my phone?" Without electricity, the hot water for the showers and cooking was heated by a fire. Sleeping so close to the ground was a new experience for some.

The two days were jam-packed full of activities for teambuilding, leadership and communication. It was nice to be together as a year group. We spoke to people we wouldn't normally see much in our classes, and hung out with our friends. Most of us hadn't done activities like that since we were year nines.

At lunchtime, we munched on cold watermelon and homegrown billington plums. The watermelon was quick to disappear. The plums were not. During our lunch break, most of us swam in the Kaipara. We splashed around in the waist deep water until we were called in. The current tugged at our legs as we walked back. In typical Kaipara Harbor fashion, 30 minutes later, the water we were swimming in was completely gone.

A week after our camp, the peer support leaders met on the quad for the Powhiri to welcome the new year nines into the school. Even in the morning, the burning hot sun made sweat bead on our foreheads. As we sat, we looked out at this year's group of year nines eagerly. It doesn't feel like long since we were year nines ourselves, with huge uniforms and schoolbags as big as us. We remember navigating the changing friendships and new classes in our first few weeks at Kaipara College. Back then, our peer support leaders felt so old and mature. It's strange to think that the year nines could think of us like that now.

After interval, we ventured out to meet our year nine classes.

During the next two days, we did a range of activities with them, including some of the teambuilding games we played at the camp and a scavenger hunt around the school.

Since then, we've met with our year nine classes every Friday during mentoring time. The year nines are a cool year group and the year thirteen's are very excited about the year to come.

I love the phrase, "build it and they will come". It's ambitious but also practical: we can make a place better for people to work and play but only if we "build" in the first place.

The key point is really the order: first, you build, then they come. The thing to "build" is all the infrastructure needed to support a decent standard of living, not just the houses. Then "they" will come to a place they can enjoy.

In the case of the electorate I represent ("Kaipara ki Mahurangi", stretching across Auckland's rural north and west) it's been the case far too often that we encourage people to come here, without having built properly beforehand.

That's as true in the rural north – think Warkworth and surrounding areas and the chokepoint that is the infamous Hill Street intersection – as it is in suburban West Auckland, where commuters crawl daily from intersection to intersection across State Highway 16.

I've been contacting government ministers and various officials about the solutions needed in these places consistently over the past 3 years. I believe it's important to offer solutions, having pointed out problems, whenever asking for more.

To that end, I've published "Penk's Plan" on my social media accounts for a couple of different geographical areas and will be expanding the map soon.

The traditional view about what needs to support people in housing still holds true, with three key elements: transport links, safe and sanitary water systems and "social infrastructure" such as schools, healthcare providers and community spaces to meet and play (and, where appropriate, places to work too). I'd add that planning in the 2020s should also include reliable, fast internet connectivity to round out the basics.

It's really the difference between "houses" and "housing". It's easy enough simply to build houses but the whole package to support reasonable living standards – the whole housing picture – needs much more thought and, dare I say it, political will.

I'll keep pushing along those lines. Wish me luck!
