

# Little free libraries flourish in Whenuapai

Out of nowhere, they suddenly popped up like toadstools – beautifully painted boxes which quickly filled with books.

The two little free libraries that have appeared in Whenuapai this year are part of the world's largest book sharing movement.

The tiny book exchanges have been created to build reading communities in our neighbourhood.

In other corners of the world, there's been a mushrooming of these little lending receptacles during the Covid-19 pandemic, with large libraries closed.

You can borrow for free, donate or exchange books. But it's not a dumping ground for old books you no longer want. Instead, you're encouraged to put in a book that you'd enjoy reading – one you'd want to share with others.

Long-time Whenuapai resident Vanessa Johnson is the guardian of the Whenuapai Village little library, situated on the edge of Malcolm Hahn Reserve on Waimarie Road, just a stone's throw from the village hall.

She came up with the idea after first seeing one in New Orleans a few years ago, and approached the Whenuapai R&R.

"I thought it was delightful, and how I'd love to have one in the village. I'm a huge book lover and it seemed like a fun and easy idea to provide books to the community," says Vanessa, who's also a primate keeper at Auckland Zoo.

"It sat on the back burner for a while, but we got there in the end!" Around the same time, Vinetta Plummer had the same bright idea. She'd worked with establishing a network of little libraries in

Massey, where some are fashioned from revamped household appliances - brightly painted fridges and a pile of microwaves.

"A little library is a great way to get community connection," Vinetta says. "They're becoming more and more popular."

So Vanessa and Vinetta worked together and got funding from Community Waitakere for a new wooden library; Vanessa's neighbour, Matt Jenkinson, offered to build it.

Vanessa then approached local artist Amber Emm to paint it. She brought local fauna and flora into the design (and included a wee fairy for younger readers to discover).

"It was a great team effort," Amber says. "It's something a bit different and unique. And it's nice to be doing something like this for our community."

Meanwhile, at the other end of Whenuapai, Beverly van Vugt decided to put up a little free library for her fast-growing community.

The library on Tamiro Road has been open for exchanging books since January.

Beverly funded the library herself, and also got Matt Jenkinson to build it.

Her friend Michelle Ogilvie Teahan did the artwork. "She has a website which is on the side of the library if people are interested

did neighbours' week where we did swap a plant and used the library as the designated area," she says.


In the near future, Beverly is also planning a Mother's Day weekend theme with cookbooks, patterns and craft books.

#### Second toll averted

In this column I'd like to focus on some positive news recently received for our electorate. It's all too easy to be consumed by bad news, particularly in what's proven to be a pretty long, hard winter for many.



As a local MP and therefore last resort for many facing problems, my electorate office and I hear stories of uncertainty and difficulty day-in-day-out. Currently there's plenty of anxiety about supply lines for various goods, stubbornly high house prices and the threat of rising interest rates and inflation.

I do think it's important, however, to shine a light on the positive where we can find it. In my case, as opposition MP, it's important to give credit where it's due when the government makes a good call.

On that note, I was pleased to hear news of a decision recently made by the Transport Minister that no further toll would be imposed on the stretch of new motorway in the vicinity of Puhoi heading north. This was being considered as part of a standard procedure and it was open to the government to make a call either way.

I had lobbied the government on this matter, emphasising that it would be unfair to have two tolls on the same route. There is already a toll in operation adjacent to Orewa.

This argument about fairness ultimately prevailed in the mind of the Transport Minister, he confirmed to me when I took the opportunity to discuss this situation with him recently.

Perhaps the biggest lesson to be taken from all this is that a community that rallies together to lobby government can sometimes achieve a win. I give credit to the "One Mahurangi" transport forum attended regularly by various community groups, local government representatives and transport agencies, along with MPs (including me as co-chair, having inherited that role from Mark Mitchell MP).

It probably goes without saying that we still have many other infrastructure needs – transport and other – in our area and I'll keep pushing the government hard on those too. For now, though, I want to take this chance to record that a win has been achieved on the motorway toll proposal. Well done all concerned! *Cheers, Chris Penk MP*







#### Getting ready for Arts in the Ville

Lockdown brings a lot of anxieties with it, but one plus is that artists preparing for Labour Weekend's 7th Arts in the Ville have some unscheduled time to work on pieces they'll have on display, some in their own studios, some in public venues including the War Memorial Hall, the Helensville Library, the Art Centre, and pop-up galleries around the town

Two artists taking advantage of lockdown time are sculptor Jeff Thomson and Marmalade Hats milliner Myra Lloyd, who have teamed up for a special exhibition of Fashionable Beasts, with Jeff's critters wearing Myra's hats.

The idea for a collaboration came from a casual comment sparked by the 'Wood and Wool' exhibition held at the Art Centre and featuring wood artist Ray Scott and textile artist Fiona McBride, both of whom will exhibit during Arts in the Ville 2021. Jeff has selected some previously made sculptures and made some new ones. "Myra saw my creatures as each having personality, their own attitudes, some quirky, others serene, and she wanted to create hats to imbue these qualities for each individual," says Jeff. "In fashion terms, this could be seen as our Spring Collection being launched in Helensville."

As they work on the project Myra and Jeff are enjoying combining not-so-compatible materials to create their novel sculptural hat stands, with Myra having to work with new materials, such as thin aluminium. "The exhibition will be a quirky, whimsical collaboration telling a story about each beast, "says Myra. She's enjoying the challenge. "Working with an animal in mind has stretched my creativity, made me look harder." Jeff agrees "I think the unusualness in the combination will be a memorable experience and have a positive impact viewers will hopefully remember for a long time."

Also featuring in Arts in the Ville, the popular treasure hunt will return. This year's theme is 'red' and Jeff Thomson will again donate one of his artworks as the prize.



Long before the days of virtual reality there were actual families and communities connected by organised recreation. In a time when travelling any great distance was difficult, there was a need to make your own fun closer to home, and make fun they did. Gatherings took place which were as much about socialising as exercising and competing - a way to keep up with the news of village life.

In 1885 the Kaukapakapa Jockey Club was formed and the first race meeting held which was attended by over 300 people. School swimming was a 'boys only' affair, which involved stripping off behind a hawthorn hedge, swimming naked and then running up and down the paddock to dry off. That's until the girls wanted in...... Next came a tennis club with courts marked out at the school, the Kaukapakapa Rifle Club in 1914, the Bowling Green in 1929 and the school pool in 1953. Add to this rugby, croquet, horse riding, hockey and cricket to name a few, and you can conjure up an image of a thriving active community.

Come along to the library and view old photos and more from Kaukapakapa's sporting past. ### Craigweil House commemorates late 'Helensvillian' artist, Chris Bailey

Craigweil House is having plaques made to commemorate the life and art of Helensville artist, Chris Bailey. A creative and kind man, Chris used to read his poetry to residents living at Craigweil House in Memory Care. Chris was born on the 16th of July 1941 in England and lived a full and interesting life. After Chris passed away in 2018, his wife Barbara Bailey contacted Craigweil House to ask if they would like to obtain a selection of his oil paintings, then hanging in her and Chris's Helensville home. Craigweil House's facility manager, David Halewood, met with Barbara and chose four of the paintings chronicling Chris's life story. She explained to David that each painting represents a unique period of Chris's life. Plaques detailing these periods are being made to be placed under each painting displayed at Craigweil House, located on Parkhurst Road, opposite the Parakai pools.

#### Landlady

At Durham University Chris read Modern Languages - French and Spanish. His first lodgings were with Mrs Jolly, a small Durham



woman who Chris said he could never see when she entered his room as the bed was so high and she was so short.

Mrs Jolly's terraced house was under the Viaduct and continually rumbled with trains puffing through on the main London/Edinburgh line.

Chris said that he could never understand what Mrs. Jolly said as her accent was a thick Durham one.

#### **Moon Landing**

In Los Angeles Chris lived on Cove Avenue in a house that was full of character, wooden beams, open fire and views that

overlooked the city. The house was on a hill-side. It was a climb down to the road and up to the back where the old V-dub was parked.

The house had an enormous rubber tree growing through its back deck.

On the night of the Moon Landing Chris and his wife, Barbara hooked the TV up under the tree and watched the news from their loungers.

The picture shows Chris walking away from the house, up the hill towards the car park.



#### **Boys By The Sea**

Chris Bailey was born in Surbiton. Surrey, England and spent his childhood in Bognor Regis.

He had happy memories of his time in Bognor, of hours spent playing on the beach.

Chris went to prepschool in Bognor and this painting shows him with his two school friends, Ellis Korn and Harris doing what they were told not to do running under the waves breaking on the promenade and getting soaking wet.



#### **South of France**

As part of The Modern Languages Course at Durham University, Chris Bailey lived for a year in Draguignan, France.



During that time he taught English at the local high school.

This painting shows his apartment, with its red carpet, black settee, flowers, the door to the balcony and the sea beyond. Chris is sitting at his desk reading a newspaper. There is a small radio on the desk. An open book is on the settee where he has been lying and reading.

Mademoiselle Cat, his landlady, is entering his room with a letter from England in her hand.

During that time, Barbara, his future wife and Chris, wrote letters to each other every day.
