

A Possum interest at Parakia Kindergarten

Recently there was a lot of excitement at Parakai Kindergarten when the tamariki (children) discovered a possum caught in the possum trap.

The interest in possums and other New Zealand pests started at the beginning of last year, when we noticed that something was eating our carrots and leaving poos in the garden. Several weeks ago we then noticed that a possum had been eating the fruit from our trees. The tamariki shared their ideas on how to trap the possum including "making a trail of leaves so the possum would eat them and then go into the trap" and their thoughts about what foods to use as bait. After weeks of experimenting, we finally caught it. There were fantastic learning discussions as the tamariki shared the knowledge they had learnt about this topic, such as "now the possum can't eat our leaves or hurt our birds" and "the trees were dying aye". This was also an amazing opportunity for the tamariki to see and learn about a possum up close.

Throughout this learning journey our tamariki have shared lots of their stories and knowledge of possums and rats and explored this interest though art, songs, stories and books. Our families have sent in photos of their own pest control journeys, built us some rat traps and the Lions Club kindly supported us to buy more native plants. This also supported the kindergarten's environmental plan to increase our native bird life in the kindergarten environment.

The Parakai Kindergarten teachers are so proud of how much respect, care and love for the natural environment the tamariki have developed as a result of this interest. We are passionate advocators of sustainable living and entwine this throughout our teaching practices. We believe that if we empower tamariki to be kaitiaki (guardians) of their environment they are more likely to take on the role of kaitiaki of our planet as adults.



The cost of Labour

The cost of construction rose a record 2.4% in the three months ended March, and 7.3% in the past year. CoreLogic chief economist Kelvin Davidson said price increases were occurring as the demand for materials outstripped supply. That's called inflation, where there is too much money chasing too few goods. Labour wants you to believe it is an international problem that is outside of their control. The truth is quite different.

Labour often touts that a record number of dwellings were consented in the year ended February at nearly 49,800. CoreLogic points out the building industry might only have the capacity to support 30,000 to 35,000 properties per year.

If they cannot get the timber when it's needed, and get it at reasonable rates, then the industry cannot build homes at an affordable price.

The cost of Labour policy starts on the forest floor. Last week the owner of a small forestry company told me that apart from the cost of diesel, all the extra costs to produce logs for timber come from government. My forestry friend pointed to environmental regulations designed to protect fresh water, which the Labour government imposed in 2020.

Their harvesting operation uses a cable hauler to lift tree stems from where they are felled to a landing where they are loaded onto trucks. The cable hauling system is like a flying fox for logs. Unlike ground-based operations where logs are dragged to a landing, cable hauling has minimal impacts on the environment.

My forester friend now needs a \$4000 resource consent for working near every watercourse in each valley. The conditions for each consent are the same. Nothing in the consents has changed the way he has worked for decades. It's just another cost.

When the logs get to the mill Labour policy rings up another cost. Sawmills need heat and energy to dry and process timber. Some sawmills utilise wood waste as well as coal to produce steam to kiln-dry the timber. However electricity and natural gas are still the main energy inputs in the North Island.

I met with the executive team of a major wood processor recently. They told me their electricity costs have almost doubled in the past two years, and natural gas would increase by 40 percent when new contracts started in April 2022. They pointed to the Labour governments' 2018 ban on offshore natural gas exploration.

Businesses depend on long term energy security to support investment in production like big timber mills. The year after the ban on gas exploration was a dry year for the hydro dam catchments. Electricity prices were much higher than normal.

At the same time natural gas supply from existing fields was restricted while long term maintenance was underway. Usually these short term supply issues would resolve themselves naturally and prices would return to long term averages. But because of the Labour government policy banning gas exploration, long term energy prices have stayed high.

Government policy imposes costs in the forest and at the timber mill. This puts up the price of timber before it even gets to the merchant. That is why ACT would focus on better policy that removes unnecessary cost from the build.

Firstly, dump the RMA and allow industries like forestry to codify how they manage environmental effects. Expensive consents would be a thing of the past. The Infrastructure Commission backs this approach. Secondly, reverse the ban on offshore exploration for gas and oil. Affordable and secure energy, which must include natural gas, is vital for a healthy economy.

These two ACT policies will help reduce inflation and deliver thriving communities.



Student Waka Ama success

Jessica Cameron is a Year 13 student at Kaipara College who has been competing in waka ama since late 2018 – initially getting involved in the sport through the school's team. Waka ama is a popular sport at Kaipara College, with many students finding both success and passion in the endeavour. Kaipara's paddlers are all signed up to Tu Tangi Ora – Helensville's local waka ama club – meaning that they are eligible to compete at both school and club competitions. The teams train regularly on the Kaipara River and frequently travel around and out of the region for inter school competitions.

After almost three and a half years of training and over 15 competitions, Jess has earned numerous impressive achievements – including her participation at a national level in the waka ama sprint and distance competitions.

At the beginning of April, Jess travelled to Lake Karapiro in Cambridge to compete in the Waka Ama World Sprints New Zealand Qualifying Event. Jess, who is only sixteen years old – and is, therefore, one of the youngest competitors in her division – placed sixth in the national W1 (single waka) 500-metre sprint for the female Under 19s category. Jess also recorded her personal best time for the event at this competition.

Jess's national placing qualifies her for the International Va'a Federation (IVF) World Sprint Club Championships – held in London in mid-August 2022. These championships will take place at Dorney Lake – a purpose-built rowing facility. With eight lanes and a length of over two kilometres, it has hosted several prestigious rowing events – from the 2006 World Rowing Championships to the 2012 Summer Olympics.

The IVF World Sprint Club Championship has 18 competition divisions for parathletes and competitors ranging from 14 to 80 years old. Over 1700 of the best paddlers from around the world will attend this competition. The championships will span over a week, with a blessing of the canoes and course familiarisation taking place before racing starts. The opening ceremony for the event will be held on August 9th, while racing will proceed over the following week until the closing ceremony on August 16th.

Jess will be competing in two events: the W1 J19 Women 500-metre sprint and the W6 (six paddlers) J19 500-metre sprint. In the latter event, Jess will compete with other paddlers from the Nga Horo Outrigger Canoe Club against other international clubs. Jess is currently dedicating 13 hours a week to training for the championships.

It continues to be disappointing, but not surprising, that there has literally been no visible progress on transport infrastructure in this area. I should no longer be surprised by the slowness of government wheels turning but cannot understand why progress has been not only slow but nonexistent. At the end of the day, it cannot and should not be difficult for organisations with the word "transport" in their name to deliver on safer roads and better transport options for everyday New Zealanders who just need to get from A to B, as quickly and as safely as possible.

The closest thing there is to an actual update concerns the right turn out of the Coatesville-Riverhead Highway onto SH16. It is being banned from May 2022, although this is long overdue and only a Band-Aid fix. Whilst this ban may make the road safer than the status quo, we are still waiting for the muchneeded roundabout that was promised. I will keep lobbying the government for this change, which will rightly deliver safer roads and better protection for our drivers.

Speaking of roads, the government has now raked in \$300,000,000 from Regional Fuel Tax. This revenue was intended to fund public transport projects yet this money has not actually been spent or even more importantly has not delivered any new transport options for Auckland. If the government are looking for some suggestions on how this revenue could be spent, I recommend the following options, just as a starting point and all within the very large electorate I represent: fixing Hill Street Intersection in the vicinity of Warkworth, fixing SH16, repairing rural roads (think potholes) and better public transport in north and northwest Auckland.

The National Party Leader and Leader of the Opposition, Christopher Luxon, visited North West Auckland recently. He witnessed the underdevelopment of infrastructure in the area, as compared with the development of housing, seeing firsthand the need to sort out the transport and other infrastructure issues facing the North West. Should National form a government at the 2023 election, we are committed to resolving the lack of transport options here. Until then, I will keep the pressure on the government to sort out the transport works that are desperately needed.


