Strength in Adversity

There is a new dawn on the horizon in 2024 for Citizens Advice Bureau Helensville.

Taku pou whakawhirinaki i nga wa

o te porotaika: My source of strength in moments of adversity one of our main sayings/whakatauki, this is certainly true as Citizens Advice Bureau Helensville reflects over 2023.

Since "Rebuilding, reconnecting and sharing" has been the emphasis of

CABNZ following COVID-19, this year started with a whitewash of weather-Auckland Anniversary flooding and Cyclone Gabrielle.

"But our volunteers responded to this crisis and CAB Helensville was open for locals needing guidance, support; power and the Internet- many who had never needed us before!" says manager Rani Timoti of Muriwai.

"They are where the magic happens, where people experience empathy, compassion and the skill and training to help them find the next steps, the pathway to deal with whatever issue or problem they are struggling with," says Kerry Dalton, CABNZ Chief Executive.

Then another wave hit us personally- our existence. Auckland Council's funding cuts threat rallied our 32 Auckland CABs.

"However, from hard times out of the tunnel- the public rallied behind us shining our light," says Rani. "Whether we expected it or not, the limelight was on our organisation, which is so often working behind-the-scenes and under valued or underrated by the powers-that-be who take from us but don't/minimally reciprocate."

Thankfully the Save our Auckland CABs petition generated more than 22.500 signatures and the media highlighted our service.

Here are a few comments from the public:

"I used CAB before. I was feeling very lost, financially strapped, and it was such a relief to talk and converse with people who knew what they were talking about and who could help navigate and advocate for one amongst the various health, social, employment, legal systems in NZ."

"These people helped me to see things another way, they gave me the time of day, they helped me unpack my issues. If it wasn't for the support, advice and compassion I may have been homeless. I am 20 now I was 17 years old then. People like me need people like them."

CAB North Shore's Impact Lab report got the council's attention too- showing that every \$1 invested in the CAB returns \$13.20 of measurable good to NZ- a massive social return on investment (SROI). Auckland Council gave us a reprieve- but there a still funding challenges ahead.

However, after our festive break where our office closes from December 18 and re-opens January 15, we're back in business.

"A number of community groups have been booking our venue during our office hours and we aim to continue our great relationship with them and build more," says Rani.

Volunteers will be at the Helensville Show on February 24 also hosting the Seniors Drop-in Zone.



What the future holds

In the period following the election, I've tried to use my time productively in the electorate.

I'm particularly enthusiastic about the prospect of getting key infrastructure projects across the line for northwest and north Auckland.

All the problems I've been talking about for the past 6 years – including in the recent election campaign – I remain very keen to help solve with a sympathetic government onboard.

Throughout it all, I'm determined to take a problem-solving approach. That might sound obvious but consider how often in the past political parties have started with clear preferences on detail, rather than focusing on providing what's needed.

A classic example is transport. Part of the issue is that if our area had more work, leisure and education opportunities locally, the amount of traffic currently on our roads could reduce. Obviously there will always be people who choose to live in this part of the world but work elsewhere, send their children to school elsewhere etc, which is fine.

But if we provide as many opportunities as possible locally – and thereby reduce the necessary number of movements needed to and from the area – that will help somewhat.

This ties into our longstanding need for an additional high school in this part of the world. I'm committed to make that happen.

And then in the domain of transport itself, our starting-point should not be a particular mode of transport that doesn't stack up (a new light rail project from scratch, anyone?) but instead to take easy wins where they can be found.

We also should be open-minded about whether a road gets built or an existing rail corridor utilized (etc) using solely government funds or whether a public-private partnership might deliver the same value much more quickly.

And the same goes for filling in those gaps in internet and mobile connectivity. I'm keen that the government help to provide solutions for those still somewhat in the dark. These could involve the extension of existing types of supply (eg upgrading copper, laying fibre, building antennae) but equally could be using new technology such as satellites.

As you can probably tell, I'm pretty excited at what might be possible for this electorate if we focus on the needs of the people. And I'm grateful for the chance to continue pushing for exactly that. Thank you.

You might recognise Andy's name from earlier editions of the Helensville Community News with his charity boxing fights that raised over \$1,000 for local charity, The Angel Fund. Also, for several years, Andy and Wendy have run a yearly charity music event called CHILL in the VILLE. This year they helped promote the D4 concert, along with the wrestling evening that was held at the Kaipara College. As a natural event organiser, Andy runs themed occasions at the River Valley Meats store: 'meet the farmer/grower' with farmers from Bradly Beef, Whenuanui Farm, Wilson Olive Oil, Helensville Honey, Lemon and Lime Grow Farm. He has also hosted chef, Mike van de Elzen, and the Hangi Master, along with watching the odd RWC rugby game with shoppers.

Andy says: "It is our belief that this region produces the best wine and beer. The local farmers produce the best beef and lamb. 

Turning waste into resource. Can you believe that our leftovers (Food waste) make up 11% of what goes into our landfills by weight (41% of household waste), that's almost the same as the amount of plastic that we dump. Worse than that, our food waste makes up 28% of landfill emissions, that's 71,400 tonnes of CO2 per year, this is worse than all the waste from the building industry. Who would have thought that sandwich crusts, apple cores and lunchbox leftovers would be so bad for our environment.

Food Scrap bins are coming to most parts of Auckland but Rural areas like Helensville are missing out (don't worry this means we aren't being charged for it). But if you are missing out on a Food Scrap bin, it's a great opportunity to start thinking about how you can reduce your food waste and look at composting or warm farming what you do have.






