

# Giant plane wows local community

The word travelled fast once it got out. Plane enthusiasts waited for hours on the roads bordering the Air Force Base in anticipation of the pending arrival.

The largest aircraft in the United States Airforce (USAF) was touching down at Royal New Zealand Airforce (RNZAF) Base Auckland.

The C-5M Super Galaxy aircraft had been tasked to deliver components required for a new C-130J Hercules Flight Simulator in New Zealand. A second delivery of equipment is pending in the coming weeks.

There had been a 'Galaxy' plane carrying the Galaxy brand to New Zealand decades ago. It's thought that it would have been around 1984. On that basis, a Galaxy would not likely to have landed at Whenuapai between 1984 and 2025.

Back to the "now"

It was a long wait on a cold night and it wasn't until around 10 pm that the aircraft touched down on the Base Auckland runway and plane spotters on the perimeter fence line got their first look at the massive plane.

Seeing the sheer size of the plane coming in to land close to Herald Island and with the navigation lights shining, the runway approach and the touchdown was a "wow" moment for the locals who had stayed in the cold to watch.

With the Super Galaxy's wingspan of 67.89 metres and a maximum takeoff weight of just over 381 tonnes, the plane was massive. Touch down was smooth. It was going to be a massive





task to fully unload the plane. A few days later there was to be a queue of fuel tankers lined up for the job.

#### New planes and new technology

Just over a year ago (September 2024) the New Zealand Air Force welcomed the first of five new C-130J Hercules to Whenuapai to replace the old C-130, which had been the workhorses of the Royal New Zealand Air Force for 60 years.

With the new Hercules fleet now in place, the time was right to install a new simulator which has the capacity to train air and ground crews.

Air Component Commander, Air Commodore Andy Scott said Continued on page 2

the simulator is a critical tool for the provision of technology, including pilot training, loadmaster systems training and engine running training, as well as procedural and mission systems training. "These new developments will take NZDF training to the next level," he said.

It also means that in the near future, RNZAF crews will not need to travel to the US for crew training on US based simulators, as this training will soon be available in New Zealand. As a result, sending flight crews back and forth between New Zealand the US will cease.

RNZAF Base Auckland's Commander Group Captain Brett Clayton, says the opportunities to use the C-5M aircraft to deliver a key piece of capability for New Zealand, should not be underestimated.

Clayton also acknowledges the strength of the relationship between the Royal New Zealand Airforce and the United States Airforce and their respective governments.

#### Full motion simulator to train air and ground crews

An integrated project team, led by the Ministry of Defence, has been working with the US Air Force, Canadian technology company CAE USA and Lockheed Martin to deliver the simulator to the New Zealand Defence Force.

The simulator will train air and ground crews operating the new planes and provide a safe and secure space for pilot training.

He said it's a really exciting time for the New Zealand Defence Force. The flight simulator is a critical tool that will provide pilot training, loadmaster systems training and engine running training.



#### Supporting Kumeu and Huapai Businesses with Flood Resilience

On October 14, businesses in Huapai and Kumeu workshopped a new initiative that could see them part of a pilot study to look at community-led flood resistance and resilience solutions.

With the Auckland Council Healthy Waters team stating that there are no feasible, community-wide flood mitigation solutions, it is seen as worthwhile in communities looking to see how they can adopt solutions together.

Sam Cooper, a local Stormwater Engineer from Holmes Group and Stormwater Engineer Jon Rix from Tonkin and Taylor



presented a proposal to develop a Tool Kit of acceptable solutions, with a possibility of the Rodney Local Board and Auckland Council accepting these solutions which will enable funding to be attracted to the area.

Insurers will also be a part of the tool kit development where assurances will be sought that if solutions are put in place, businesses will then be able to obtain insurance cover.

North West Country will look to sponsor the project and support local businesses. Discussions are ongoing so look out for updates.



## **U3A South** Learn, laugh, live Kaipara

If someone collapsed with a cardiac arrest right in front of you would you know what to do? This happened at our September monthly meeting with 33 members present. Our guest speaker, 5 mins into his presentation, collapsed.

The good news here is that our members did know what to do, and this man defied statistical probability and

survived. He survived because CPR was commenced immediately. emergency services were called and a defibrillator (AED) was rapidly obtained from across the road and put to use. While all this was happening, cars were moved to allow access for emergency vehicles, others were down the road watching out for the fire truck and ambulance. The rest of the group had the sensitivity to stand back, quietly clear the room of chairs to provide easy access for the fire brigade volunteers followed by the ambulance crew. Meanwhile we know of one man who simply sat in his car, intentionally supporting our guest's spirit. There may also have been others sitting prayerfully.



For 10 or more minutes we were on our own. The AED (automated external defibrillator) shocked our guest 3-4 times and we kept up CPR until the wonderful volunteer fire brigade volunteers took over. The ambulance arrived quite some time later. Active resuscitation continued for more than 30 mins before heading off to North Shore Hospital.

The good news continues, our guest speaker is home again, still rather sore and tired, but with no evidence of brain or cardiac damage. He is eager to finish the book he is

half way through writing.

At the fire brigade volunteers next training meeting a group from our U3A went along to thank them and let them know the outcome. We were very saddened to find that they rarely hear what has happened to the people they were involved in rescuing, and even rarer, are they thanked. Our thankyou banana cake went down very well.

Off this experience we strongly encourage all readers, to .....

- do regular CPR refresher courses no matter what your age,
- know how to quickly locate a nearby defibrillator download the AED (defibrillator) app on your phone, open it and search for your area. You will be shown a map with locations and times defibrillators are available. Some are 24/7, others set times. Or practice Google searching 'AEDs near me' for AED locations. Go and find an AED in your area and study the instructions on it.
- always carry identity and contact details for next of kin.
- If involved in a crisis, let the emergency responders know the

## Bees, Swarms and the Sweet Rhythm of Nature

A swarm of bees in May is worth a bushel of hay; A swarm in June is worth a silver spoon; A swarm in July isn't worth a fly.

This Northern Hemisphere proverb holds true here but starting with October. It neatly shows that a swarm in October will be strong and have the whole season to grow and thrive, ensuring winter survival; their value decreases through the season until they are no longer viable. Honey bees swarming is a natural function of reproduction of the hive. Bees live and die, but for their species to continue these social insects need their colony to

While this is a natural behaviour in honey bees, likely used for about twenty five million years, they now don't usually survive in the wild for much more than a year due to the bees' mortal enemy - the varroa mite. In early spring bees work very hard to rear



their young and bring in stores of nectar and pollen. When they deem that there is sufficient stores and bees, the swarming impulse kicks in and they begin the preparation to swarm. The worker bees build swarm cells and the queen lays eggs in these special cells, with a diet almost entirely of royal jelly, these queens-to-be develop in their cells. The old queen is then put on a diet and chased around to help her to get fit enough to fly.

Nine days later, the queen cells are capped over, this is the signal for the old queen and up to half of the workers who have filled their honey stomachs with honey to depart. In the next week a new queen will emerge and usually kill her royal sisters in their cells. She then goes out on her mating flight and if successfully mated, will stay in the hive laying eggs until it is her time to swarm.

When leaving a hive the swarm will settle on a branch, fence post, eaves of a house or similar about 50-100m from the hive. They will stay there for up to a week but usually a day or two until scout bees find their forever home and then they will depart. It is in this temporary state that they are easiest to capture. If you see a bee swarm, the best thing to do is call an experienced swarm collector, they are volunteers and don't usually charge anything. You could ask on your local community page for swarm collectors or check out Auckland Beekeepers Club website, they have dozens of swarm collectors on their list and will quickly and efficiently collect the swarm, rehousing and treating them for mites and checking for any other diseases. When the swarm has been collected it is taken to the beekeeper's apiary (where their hives are).

An interesting fact about bee swarms is that honey bees are at their most placid when swarming; remember that bees are defensive not aggressive. When they are swarming they don't have brood or food to protect, so will not attack (that's only in the movies or in the Americas with their Africanised bees). Rather than being scared of 8,000 venomous insects on the rampage, marvel at the wonder of nature in all her glory.

It was great to host the Minister of Transport, Chris Bishop, here in northwest Auckland recently. We spent the day looking at some of the key transport priorities for our community — and it was encouraging to see plans and progress coming together, slowly but surely.



We began with a visit to the current roadworks along State Highway 16. This stretch of highway has long been a source of frustration for locals due to congestion and safety concerns, so it's very welcome to see improvements now taking shape. Once complete, these works will make travel safer and smoother for everyone using this crucial route between our growing townships and the city.

Another key focus was the proposed Kumeu Bypass. For years, residents have called for a better way to divert heavy traffic away from Kumeu's town centre. # Opinion: Powering the Growth of North West Auckland

North West Auckland is booming. From Kumeu to Helensville, families are building homes, small businesses are opening their doors, and the region is fast becoming one of the most dynamic parts of New Zealand.

But with that growth comes a critical question: how are we going to power it?

Reliable, affordable energy isn't just a 'nice to have' for growing communities, it's essential. Whether you're running a café on Commercial Road, a joinery in Huapai, or managing a subdivision in Riverhead, you need electricity that's there when you need it and prices that don't break the bank.

That's why ACT in Government is fixing what matters.
